Welcome Aboard Dick!


The Board has elected Dick Luedeke a Director and Vice-President of the Association. Dick was the Chairman of our Finance Committee and will bring a strong financial

The Niguel Shores Landscape Committee now has a new chairman, Larry Mahaffy. Larry is taking Jim Miller's place as Jim is moving from the area. Good luck Jim, and thanks again for all the hardwork and true concern, that you gave to the community.

The committee has been working hard trying to solve, not appease, our landscaping problems. Several very large steps forward have been achieved. The first being an equal and objective division of the committee to view and inspect each separate portion of the Shores and Sea Terrace areas, in which they respectively live. The committee has also made a long awaited policy decision on tree trimming, topping and removal (with Board of Directors approval). This will involve only these trees on slope areas. The trees on the upper 50% of the bank will be trimmed for beight, meaning the lower branches will be removed and the specimen well be allowed to grow to maximum height. The lower 50% of the slope will have the trees topped to allow view from the pad level. The committee is in hopes that this will talkace the need for both trees and views.



However, note in your booklet that any landscaping, cement work, brick work, or anything that might disturb the existing drainage or slope requires the prior approval of the Architectural Committee. January 18, 1976 is our first Potluck in this bicentennial year. The new Potluck chairman is Jean Wells. Call Jean for reservations at 493-2098.




By this time you will have received your notice of the Fourth Annual Meeting to be held on Monday, January 12, 1976 at the Niguel Shores Community Association Center.

#### TENNIS REPORT

The Communications Committee has requested that the tennis regulations be printed in the Sea Shore News and urges that it be retained by all that use the tennis facilities.

TENNIS REGULATIONS

1. Tennis shoes and appropriate attire are urged.

2. Children under 6 are not allowed on the courts unless playing tennis and accompanied by adults. Children over 6 must be players or seated spectators. No activities other than tennis are to occur on any tennis court at any time.

3. No food allowed on courts.

4. Court sign-ups will be taken in the recreation office on a first come, first serve basis. Courts may be reserved at 7 p.m. a day and a half ahead of playing time desired.

5. Courts on weekdays will be reserved on a family basis with no more than one reservation per family per day. Weekend reservations will be on an individual basis with no one individual being allowed more than one time slot per day.

6. Tennis etiquette is to be observed at alltimes.

7. All scheduled courts must be relinquished when time is up.

8. Center sponsored play will have priority over courts 3 and 4 on weekends only.

9, Players are encouraged to play doubles when possible and during "prime" times.

10. If a court is not occupied within 5 minutes of scheduled time, it will be relinquished for the use of racking players or stand-by players on a first come first serve basis.

11. Members must observe posted court rules.

12. All tennis clinics, all private charged lessons, or any such group tennis instruction must be approved by Center Manager two weeks prior to being conducted and must be open to all residents. No tennis lessons will be permitted during prime weekend playing times.

The first timers tournament had to be cancelled due to lack of entrants. These people are doubly encouraged to participate in the next Mixed Doubles Tournament.

There will be a mixed doubles hat draw tournament January 24 and 25. Everyone sign up at the Rec Center. The cost is \$2.00. and the deadline for signup is January 20.

The Tennis Committee is collating the December questionaires that were returned. Here are some of the majority suggestions:

- 1. Have a signup sheet on the racking court.
- 2. Have many different kinds of tournaments.
- 3. Have a different Host/ Hostess for each tournament.

4: Have a clock visible from all courts.

5. Install a lowfence between courts to catch balls.

6. Have better and quicker repairs on nets. (Report the need to office.)

7. Require residents to be with guests due to non-residents playing on our courts

8. Require phone and address when making reservations and present key card when checking in.

9. Announce times over loud speaker.

10. Enforce rules for not cancelling. Check in 5 minutes before scheduled time.

Two additional suggestions...

1. Please do not hit the balls or throw racquets against the wind screens. Many are apparently unaware that this causes tears and ultimately destroys them.

2. There have been complaints of violations of the time rules on the weekend; that some play on the courts more than once.
