FROM THE HELM

At the Board Meeting on December 7th the Directors, in cooperation with the Woman's Club, authorized the purchase of draperies for the Recreation Center. The addition of drapes will represent a major step toward solving our accoustical problems. We will watch the results to see if further steps may be necessary.

The Directors adopted and announced a Tree Policy for the Association. It is as follows:

1. The Association will trim, prune and thin trees located on common properties through the use of our contractor in accordance with the Lange (consultant) study/report.
2. Removal of trees, if any, will be made only upon the recommendation of Mr. Lange after the full sequence of trimming, pruning and thinning has been completed (in each area). View blockage problems after full trimming, pruning and thinning have been completed must be submitted to the Association in writing for review and will be expedited on a priority basis. Removal of trees may be subject to financial arrangements between the homeowner and the Association.
3. Trees on private property shall be primarily considered a matter between neighbors but are subject to the view provisions of the C. C. and R.'s.

There are separate articles in this Sea Shore News dealing with the 1977 Budget/Assessment and Security. Both matters have been the subject of special fliers and/or mailings. I invite you to read these reports carefully.

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS

Effective January 3, 1977, the following changes will be made in the operation of the Shores and Mariner gates:

- The Mariner entrance will be manned by a guard 24 hours/day.
Telephone number of Mariner guard station 496-6301.
- The Shores entrance will be manned by a guard from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.. When the guard is not on duty, the entrance gate will operate by key card - except from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m., during which time it will be closed and chained.
Telephone number of Shores guard station 496-5915.
- The Selva gates will also be closed and chained from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

We are trying to make our guard system more effective and would appreciate continued help from residents. The following are some suggestions and information which may be helpful:

- Residents should call the Sheriff directly in case of violence, burglary, vandalism, trespassing, suspicious persons, unreasonable noise or disturbance, etc..
Toll free number for the Sheriff is Zenith 7-9999.
Please do not call the gate guard or Community Center Office to ask them to call the Sheriff because time will be wasted and important details may be omitted.
- When you call the guard station to request admittance of guests or others, please make your calls brief.
When guards are on the telephone it's difficult for them to check incoming vehicles. Also, make your calls as early in the day as you can to avoid tying up the guards with telephone calls at peak traffic times, such as 4:30 p.m. to 7 p.m.
- We are reissuing the instructions to the guards. To avoid misunderstandings and possible controversy, we want residents to be familiar with the instructions which the guards are expected to follow.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE NIGUEL SHORES COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION GUARDS

1. Keep the gate arm down except when admitting vehicles.
2. Admit vehicles with:
 - Current NSCA stickers,
 - Temporary passes (if signed by Ray Longbotham or Steve Sonies, and if the pass has not expired),
 - Authorization from a resident.

Place a one-day pass on the windshield of each guest vehicle. If a resident expects more than six (6) vehicles bringing guests to a party, meeting, etc., then the resident should deliver a written list of the guests' names to the guard station. If a resident authorizes admittance of more than twenty (20) vehicles, the Community Center Office must be notified.

3. Log date, time of arrival, and license number of each non-resident owned truck, van, recreation vehicle, camper, moving van, or rental truck.

3. Log date, time of arrival, and license number of each non-resident owned truck, van, recreation vehicle, camper, moving van, or rental truck.
4. If a person displays a key card for identification, do not open the gate, but ask him/her to open the gate with their key card.
5. If a person says he/she lives here but does not have a sticker, pass, or key card, ask to see his/her driver's license. Permit the individual to enter only if his/her license is for an address in the Community.
6. Advise residents who do not have current NSCA stickers on their vehicles to obtain stickers from the Community Center Office.
7. Log all incoming telephone calls.
8. Make a written record of all disputes with residents or others.
9. Do not give out telephone numbers or any other information about residents.
10. Do not permit loitering around guard station.
11. You are not required to take orders from anyone other than your supervisor.

The policy is aimed at protecting the entire community homes with and without views and we believe this policy to be a good one. It will be enforced in its entirety and the association will avail itself of any legal remedy.
