LANDSCAPE CONTRACT RENEWED

The landscaping contract with Comprehensive Landscape Design Corporation has been renewed for the 1979 year. Several important additions and changes were made in the contract which will improve their services over last year. The contract provides for two additional men that will only work on the slopes in the community, especially where they are infested with weeds. In addition, the crew will arrive each morning at 7:15 a.m. and leave at 3:30 p.m. during the week. With these changes and several other improvements in the new contract, we look forward to even better landscaping services in 1979.


COMMUNITY PROJECTS STATUS REPORT

We have completed the slurry seal of our streets and the repair of the slope failures, but many other projects are completed or underway which our members should know about. The swinging gates at Selva have been repaired. Major street lighting problems on Ionian Bay, Nauticus Isle and Bothnia Bay have been resolved by replacing faulty aluminum wire with new copper wire.

At the community center, all the light fixtures in the bathrooms have been replaced with energy saving flourescent tubes. The restroom walls are being made ready for painting and will be painted during inclement weather. Work is underway to install a drain and vault adjacent to the handball courts. Where once we had a safety hazard and an eyesore, we will soon have a finished drain vault regraded and planted with lawn.

The rains have delayed the completion of the drain installations below Windward and Windjammer but they should be finished in February. Another drain is being installed along Crossjack with vault and pump installed sending the water to the storm gutter on Windward. This drain was needed to catch water seepage that was undermining the asphalt street and causing serious damage on Crossjack.

SUBJECT:

Role of Homeowner Activities in the Community's Seepage Problems

Our continuing studies of the seepage problems in the Community indicate that water entering the ground from the surface is a major contributor to the seepage and shallow groundwater conditions in much of the Niguel Shores Community. The reason for this is that water is unable to percolate to great depths beneath the ground in this area. The bedrock underlying the Community is very impermeable, so water from the surface fills up the available pore space in the 10 to 30 feet of sands that sit on top of the bedrock. We have installed a number of corrective drainage devices to remove excess water from the soil and help relieve the problem. Another very helpful step would be for the homeowners and the Association to keep their lawn and garden sprinkling to a minimum. I am sure that your landscape contractor can suggest varieties of plants that can tolerate smaller amounts of water, but another useful step each homeowner could take would be to check his own sprinkler system for leaks and to be sure that automatic sprinklers are shutting off when they should. During these winter months, little sprinkling if any should be required.

Our second major area of concern is the status of drains in the rear yards of many homes in the Community. We believe it is the homeowners' responsibility to maintain these drains in working order. They serve a very useful purposeto remove surface water from heavy rains to the storm drains or the street below rather than contributing additional water to the subsurface soils. The Association office now has maps that show the locations of most of the drains in the Community.

We will be continuing our work in the Community to improve the drainage and reduce seepage problems. The cooperation of your Association members is important in helping keep the need for additional repairs, and their associated costs, to a minimum.

NIGUEL SHORES NEWSPAPER AND ALUMINUM RECYCLING PROGRAM

Newspaper pickups for February will be February 12 and 26. These are the normal 2nd and 4th Mondays.

During the past holidays, combined with rainy Mondays, there has been considerable confusion as to when, (or whether) to put out papers for pickup. Now that the holidays are past, we need only consider the rain possibilities. A discussion with our recycler, John Leensvaart, has produced the following plan: Under normal conditions, papers will be picked up starting the second and fourth Mondays of each month, after 2 p.m. in the afternoon. Sometimes, due to unforseen circumstances, the truck may come later in the evening, or even during the night.

During rainy periods, Mr. Leensvaart will try to pick a time between rain squalls, and he asks that you delay putting out papers until the heavy rains diminish, and cover them with plastic and weights to protect them from the moisture as far as possible. If the rains do not let up, Mr. Leensvaart guarantees that he will come through the area not later than early Tuesday morning, before the trash pickup people come through. The Solag people will not take papers in cartons, or untied, so if you use weights and do not tie them, there will be no danger of the trash people taking them away.

If you feel that you cannot protect your papers from moisture sufficiently, there is no reason why you cannot hold them up for the next regular pick-up two weeks later.

We thank you all for your help and cooperation in this great project.

Our first aluminum pickup resulted in a net 152 pounds, and \$25.84 added to our salvage funds. This was not bad for the first round, but we hope to increase the weight considerably in the months to come. This community consumes a great number of cans of beer and soft drinks, and the containers (if aluminum) add up to about 19 containers to the pound. Please remember to save the containers for recycling. Also recyclable are TV dinner plates, cake and pie plates supplied for frozen food sales, aluminum foil, and many other forms. HOWEVER, dog and cat food is usually packaged in TIN CANS, and these containers are not acceptable. Please do not contribute tin to the aluminum bin.

One last word about aluminum Beverage cans - they are quite bulky and our bin fills up fast with a lot of air (inside the cans) unless the cans are crushed - flattened out. If possible, please crush the cans before delivery to the bin. We can get a lot more into the bin if you will do this.

The next expenditure of funds from our salvage efforts will be \$111.10 for a projection screen for our Community Center. This screen will be mounted on the wall of the General Purpose Room and available to all who use the room for meetings, etc.

REFUSE REGULATIONS.

Rubbish must be out by 6:00 a.m.

Total weight of container and contents not to exceed 50 pounds.

Household collection to maximum of (8) 40 gallon containers Newspapers may be placed in containers or bundled, not to exceed the 50 pound weight.

Cardboard barrels or oil drums are not legal containers. Metal trash cans, plastic cans or bags are 0.K.

Newspapers, if not in a container, should be bundled and tied. Tree trimmings, if not in a container, should be tied into bundles not over four (4) feet in length or over two (2) feet in diameter, nor weigh over 50 pounds.

The following items will not be taken on regular route pick-ups: SOD, DIRT, ROCKS, OR ANY CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL, FURNITURE, APPLIANCES, PLASTERBOARD ETC.,

ALL HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE SHOULD BE WRAPPED, (paper or plastic).

Ashes should be placed in bags, securely closed or in throw-away boxes, completely covered.

FLATTEN AND TIE EMPTY MOVING BOXES.

Spraying containers with an Ammonia solution is a deterrent to animals.

Do not leave toys or other objects near the trash, <u>unless</u> you want them removed.

We do not pick up on THANKSGIVING, CHRISTMAS OR NEW YEARS DAY.

If one of these days falls on your scheduled day, your pick-up will be on the following DAY!


