The Board increased the Fidelity Bond from \$100,000 to \$400,000 at a cost of \$621.00 for three years to accommodate lender requirements for members who are refinancing.

The Board approved reconstruction of the Garden Homes entry structure on Atlantic which was paid for by the insurance of Solag Disposal.

The Board approved a contract for carpeting in an amount not to exceed \$1863.00 for the office. It is the same quality carpeting as recently installed in the Multi-Purpose Room. The Board accepted the lowest of four bids on this carpeting.

The Board approved \$3800.00 for card reader memory upgrade from 4000 to 8000 capacity. It will also include 500 new key cards.

The Roard adooted policy requiring payment to the Association of from **a**11 income-producing activities. This fee is intended to off-set the costs of wear, maintenance, etc. However, the income is considered Recreation Auxiliary income and its use is administered through the Recreation Committee. Specific damage costs will continue to be charged to the user.

The Board appointed Donna Rosecrans, Recreation Committee Chairperson; Lynda Bracken, member of Legal Committee; and member of Legal Gres Blackburn, Committee.

We continue to need members for the Finance and Architectural Committees. Please let the office know if you can help in these area.

The next Open Board Meeting will be Wednesday, February 18 at 80m in the Multi-Purpose Room of the Community Center. Please come and give us your input.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

A new rule is adopted!

For some time now, skateboards have been the subject of discussions and concern. While the Association would like to promulgate as few rules and regulations as possible. it becomes necessary to add a rule for the common good. We've all seen the fun that young people have on skateboards. Lately, however, skateboard-related activites have caused concern for members'/quests' safety and DOSE Association liability exposure.

After some consideration, the Board adopted a new rule which is also an Orange County ordinance, DCCD #6-4-8. The rule (codified) states: "No person shall ride or cause to roll or coast any skateboard, roller skate or other conveyance powered by human DOMEL except a bicycle on the roadway portion of any highway. Does not apply on culde-sacs less than 500 feet long.

Increased Enforcement: The South County Division of the Drange County Sheriff has been asked to increase their enforcement of the California codes within the community under the existing authority (Orange County Resolution 76-173). Members that use of reminded skateboards. mopeds, motorcycles and autos by young people must be done in accordance with the California Vehicle Code and Brange County Ordinances. Violators will be cited.





2715 Tenancy Fee (2-1-85)

beginning January 1, 1984, a tenancy fee of \$100.00 will be charged for each new tenancy registration or change of tenancy in any member's unit. Tenancy is defined as any person or family occupying a unit and not residing with the owner(s) in that unit. This tenancy administrative fee is in addition to current security fee charged for each security package (one car decal and one key card per vehicle) issued to a tenant.

2301 Accounts Unpaid for 30 Days (11-5-86)

Members whose accounts have a balance outstanding of 30 days or more are assessed a late charge of \$10 per month and the then legal rate of interest on a monthly basis. Reminder billings are sent by computer service.

2302 Accounts Unpaid for 60 Days (2-1-85)

Members whose accounts are 60 days delinquent are noticed by registered mail that if payment in full is not received within 30 days, a lien will be filed against the property.

2303 Accounts Unpaid for 90 Days (11-5-86)

Members with delinquent accounts of 90 days are liened. Members are assessed a charge for lien filing and administrative costs (minimum charge \$50.00).

2304 Accounts Unpaid for 91 Days (2-1-85)

Members whose accounts are 91 days delinquent are referred to the Board of Directors for suspension of Association voting rights and use of common area/facility privileges, (including participation in committees, clubs and organized community events) which includes use by the member, his guests and tenants, pursuant to suspension procedures.

2305 Accounts Unpaid for 120 Days (2-1-85)

Members whose accounts are 120 days delinquent are sent to the Association's attorney for collection action, which includes filing a Notice of Default. Members are assessed a minimum fee of \$300.00 for attorney fees.

2306 Accounts Unpaid for 150 Days (2-1-85))

Failure to cure a delinquency of more than 150 days may result in foreclosure proceedings against the property.
