If they have a learner's permit, they still must be accompanied by an adult. The Sheriff's Department does have the authority to give tickets within the gates, per Orange County Resolution 76-173.

Cal-Trans was very cooperative in helping remove the graffiti from both exterior sides of the bridge. There is a reward for any information leading to the arrest and conviction of the people involved.

MORE VANDALISM

In the December 86 issue, I commented on the on-going VANDALISM within Niguel Bhores, the cost of repairs which must be borne by all members, and a reminder about the standing offer of REWARD (\$\$) for information leading to the arrest and conviction of those who cause such damage. A reward is also paid if the Association recovers repair costs from individuals causing such damage.

IT'S HAPPENED ABAIN! Recently, considerable graffiti appeared on both sides of our bridge over the Coast Highway and on the street and inside walls as well. The assistance of CalTrans kept our costs down; however, even a lesser expense is unacceptable.

In addition, two weeks ago 30 to 40 young people forced entry into our Community Center Multi-Purpose Room and a beer party followed. Fortunately, our security guard came upon the "party" in progress before any major damage occured. Investigation continues to identify those responsible.

MEMBERS MUST BE ALERT, and report any suspicious activities to the Sheriff and/or Management immediately. This will keep such vandalism and tresspassing from happening.

1986 AUDIT

Authorized audit of the Association's 1986 financial records and preparation of the Federal and Btate income taxes.

COMPUTER PRINTER

Authorized replacement of the Administrative Office computer printer to improve print quality for reports, Beashore News, etc.

BRAFFITI REMOVAL

Acknowledged Cal-Trans assistance in removing the graffiti on the outside of the PCH bridge and the NSCA staff's removal of the graffiti on the inside of the bridge.

INCORPORATION HEARING

Took note of the incorporation hearing scheduled by the Local Agency Formation Commission for March 4, 1987 at the Drange County Hall of Administration.

LNCC REPREBENTATIVE

Endorsed the recommendation of the Community Relations Committee to submit the name of Don Beaver to the Laguna Niguel Community Council to fill the unexpired term of Candice Rurroughts who recently resigned as District 18 Representative.

BWIMMING POOL REPAIR


Directed further study of the major repair needs of the swimming pool and deck based upon input and comment by the Orange County Health Department and our insurance carrier.

TIRE DAMAGE

Denied a claim for reimbursement of costs related to tire damage occuring at an entrance gate. Denial was based on a lack of verifiable and/or supporting information indicating gate malfunction.

LEGAL COUNSEL REPORT

Acknowledged current legal activity which includes six architectural enforcement matters (including two suits for enforcement), one tree view blockage matter, five assessment collection matters, six suits, three of which are related to the Beach/Slope Revetment problem, four insurance claims and other miscellaneous legal opinions and analyses.



MEMO FROM THE ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE

Homeowners are reminded that all modification to existing premises, other than interior changes, can be started only after approval by the Architectural Control Committee of a properly prepared and completed application.

This includes, but is not limited to, such additions or modifications as skylights, pools, spas, decks, walls, fences, awnings, patic covers. Approval is also required for exterior painting if it involves any change from the existing colors, re-roofing, if different materials or colors are desired, and the placement of trees or shrubs which at maturity and without pruning would exceed three feet in height.

Section 3100, Architectural Regulations and Guidelines, of the NSCA Rules covers, in detail, modifications which are allowed or prohibited, and this section should be reviewed by any homeowner who is contemplating exterior modifications.

Architectural Control Committee Submittal Forms are available in the Association office and accet 7100 submitted at least one week before next regularly scheduled meeting of the committee. A minimum of two additional weeks should be allowed for approval and notification, and more time may be required if the submital is not clear or if modifications are necessary to conform with the rules.


NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Neighborhood Watch is an ongoing, nationwide effort to reduce crime in local communities and neighborhoods. From its inception, burglary prevention has been a major concern of In many communities introduction of Neighborhood Watch has resulted in reductions of up to fifty percent in residential burglaries.

In Niquel Shores our Neighborhood Watch plan has been in effect since was started with 1t cooperation of the Orange County Sheriff's Office which provided many of the materials used in the program. Because we are a unique community with restricted vehicle access, our program primarily focused on burglary The very few burglaries prevention. that have occurred over the past four years are persuasive evidence that the program does work.

The following are some significant facts about the crime of burglary:

- majority of household burglaries occur during daylight hours.
- 2. Police statistics show that in over one-half of all home burglaries there was no forced entry involved.
- Most home burglars are young amateurs looking for easy targets and easy money.
- Over one-half of police time is spent on investigating burglaries.
- Household burglary is one of the easiest crimes to prevent, but one of the most difficult to solve.




WOMENS CLUB ANNOUNCEMENT


