Powers

To exercise all corporate powers.
To control the business and affairs of the Association.

To select and remove officers, agents and employees, prescribe their duties, and fix their compensation.

To adopt and publish rules and regulations and to establish penalties for infractions.

To maintain common areas and facilities including slopes.

Duties

To approve the Annual Budget.

To fix the Annual Assessments.

To supervise all officers, agents and employees.

To contract and pay premiums for insurance, etc.

To keep a complete record of its acts and corporate affairs.

To cause an Annual Audit, a copy of which must be made

available to each member.

To appoint all Committees.

To enforce the CC&R's.

The By-Laws also specify the powers and duties of Officers such as Chairman - if one is appointed - President, Treasurer and Secretary.



FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT
The NSCA Reserve Program

In 1979 your Board of Directors formalized a reserve policy which provided that a portion of the annual assessment collected by the NSCA will be accumulated for the replacement, repair or restoration of commonly owned facilities. The reserve is intended to provide funds for larger cost items which will be required periodically on other than a yearly

basis. This is in contrast to on-going maintenance activities which are regularly performed each year. Examples of the types of costs provided for in the reserve include street slurry, street resurfacing, community building roofs, gate replacement, etc. As you can see, each constitutes a rather large expenditure in the year that it would need to be made.

Without the reserve method of assessment, the dues could fluctuate as much as 50% between years depending on the Association's needs for a particular year - obviously an undesirable situation. With the reserve formula in use, these bulges are spread evenly over the years when large expenditures are not required as well as those in which they must be made. The result is a more orderly assessment schedule and a more equitable distribution of cost to all homeowners, new as well as those leaving. Considerable effort is spent on a continuing basis by the Finance Committee and the staff in establishing the items to be included, together with associated cost estimates and the time periods over which the funds must be accumulated. The Board watches over the reserve to assure that it is used properly and does not build up beyond the community's requirements.

As our facilities age, more and more repair & replacement of these significant items will be required. For instance, in the last 3 years all but one of our gates has been replaced and the swimming pool is under study for rehabilitation at the present time. The reserve has not only provided for most of these costs but has given the Board the freedom to do this work when it was most economical rather than the alternative of making costly interim repairs while waiting for money to be put into the succeeding year's budget.

The reserve money is currently invested in certificates of deposit (insured) and is earning as good a rate of interest as is consistant with security.

In Retrospect

Acting upon committee recommendations, the Niguel Shores Board, during my tenure, initiated or completed a number of improvements, including the following:

- 1. The present management team, legal counsel and security firm were selected.
- 2. Administrative policies and procedures were upgraded.
- Our gate and entry systems were improved.
- 4. Substantial progress was made in improving our drainage system.
- 5. The reclaimed water proposal was accepted.
- 6. The Salt Creek memorandum of agreement was adopted.

The Future

The Board should continue to give attention to items outlined above and give consideration to the following:

- 1. Committees We cannot function effectively without them. They should be supported to the fullest possible extent.
- 2. Reclaimed Water MWD water will become less plentiful and more expensive. We need to seek the best possible terms for cheap landscape water.
- 3. <u>CC&R Enforcement</u> A conscientious enforcement of the intent of our rules, regulations and policies is mandatory.
- 4. Staff Morale Is an important factor in the efficient operation of our association.
- 5. Constructive Suggestions from homeowners should be encouraged.

SEA TERRACE II

At the annual meeting in February Sea Terrace II elected three new members of the Board of Directors for two year terms. They are: (1) Jack Broering; (2) Frieda Baskin; and (3) Don Lutz. Another matter of business concluded at the meeting was the completion of a change in the C.C.&Rs reducing the requirement for future changes to sixty percent of the homeowner members. Also, the opinion of approximately half of the membership was obtained regarding earthquake insurance. Slightly more members opposed than favored this form of insurance at this time.

VOICE OF THE PEOPLE

RECLAIMED WATER

There are two disturbing facts which make the Water District's proposal to supply us with reclaimed water a matter deserving close examination:

- 1. The '82 Board of Directors chose to request the formation of a Special Assessment District on their own initiative, thus depriving Association members a vote as provided by our CC&Rs. The '83 Board of Directors rejected the opportunity to correct this unfair procedure by refusing our request for a straw vote. Why? Is this project of such dubious value it cannot pass the test of a fair vote??
- 2. We are asked to spend more than \$1,000,000 to insure land-scaping valued at approximately \$300,000 against a prolonged drought, which may or may not occur.

Conserving our natural resources is important but let us be sure our dollars are spent wisely in areas where there is a proven need. We should follow the example of some of our neighboring water districts who are taking a "wait and see" approach to avoid what could be a very expensive fiasco.

AEROBICISE -- FIL SS WITH A FLAIR

WHAT IS AEROBICISE?

1. A well structured aerobic exercise class must include:

Stretching - Stretching the muscles of your limbs and trunk area is necessary before faster paced demands are made on your body. Short, tight muscles are more prone to injury than are long, elastic muscles.



- 2. Warm-up Class will begin with a standing warm-up to increase the heart rate and pump blood out to your muscles where it is needed. This time is valuable mentally as well as to gain enthusiasm for your workout.
- 3. Cardiovascular Segment Sustained cardiovascular "work" will be performed. This is the aerobic segment from which the class receives its name. Emphasis is on movement to elevate the heart rate level between 60% and 80% of your maximum heart rate and sustaining that level for a minimum of 12 minutes, three times a week. You will learn to take your pulse and adjust you movements to reduce or increase your heartrate to bring it into the optimal range.



- 4. Cooldown A very important period after any aerobic activity, this 5 minute period of slower movement allows the heart rate to decrease and keep large amounts of blood, now in your system, from pooling in your muscles and causing dizziness or fainting.
- 5. Exercises Though spot reducing is a myth, "spot" or area strengthening is not only possible but beneficial in gaining strength and making for a well defined body. Exercises for each major muscle group will be executed, helping to balance your body's strengths.



6. More Stretching - Yes! Studies show that stretching should be done both before and after exercise. A post-workout stretch will relax muscles and also minimize muscle soreness.

NIGUEL SHORES COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION Exercise Class Registration Procedures

INSTRUCTORS

Exercise classes are offered at Niguel Shores by private instructors, and are not subsidized by the Association. Therefore preregistration and payment of fee is required prior to registration cut off dates and prior to attendance.

FEES AND REGISTRATION

- 1. Classes are held once or twice per week, with fees paid on a monthly basis. Classes not meeting enrollment minimums may be cancelled.
- 2. Checks are made payable to the individual instructor and must be presented to the Association office upon registration.
- 3. Registration fees may not be pro-rated, except that late registration will be accepted, subject to enrollment maximums.
- 4. Students are required to register at the Association office prior to attending the first class of each month, and must present the registration receipt to the instructor when arriving at the first class-

MAKE UP-SUBSTITUTE CLASSES

- 1. Fees are based on attendance at only one class per week. Students may not attend more than one class per week, except as provided below.
- 2. Students unable to attend a scheduled class may attend another class offered by the same instructor, only during the same month and subject to prior approval by the instructor.
- 3. Students may not attend classes offered by other instructors in lieu of attendance at scheduled class date/times.

GUFSTS

1. Non-resident guests of registered students may attend classes on a one-time only basis, subject to payment of the guest fee and registration at the Association office.


