If you, a majority of the residents, want to increase your monthly payments to our Association to cover the expense of our own police department, I expect that our Board of Directors will listen to your pleas.

Another alternative to deter speeders would be the installation of a series of road bumps in your neighborhood, but the Committee feels that this is not desirable.

If you wish to vote in the June primary you must be registered by May 5th to qualify. Registration is permanent and you need to re-register only if you:





Wind", and "Confidence and Control"


