BOARD IS CONSIDERING REMOVAL OF CONCRETE ROADWAY ON ATLANTIC AND SHORES GARDEN HOMES STREETS

Residents who live within the Atlantic and Shores Garden Home tracts are aware of the cracking of the concrete roadway under the street entry structures. The concrete is below the entry structure and is as wide as the street and approximately twenty-five feet long. The Board has received bids to remove the concrete and replace it with either concrete or asphalt. It will be far more costly to use concrete than asphalt.

The cost figures reflect that using asphalt will be approximately half the cost of using concrete. The cost to do one entry with concrete will be approximately \$5300. Asphalt replacement will cost approximately \$2600. One additional advantage with asphalt, tires will not make noise. If concrete is chosen, the replacement will be as close to what exists today as it pertains to pattern and color.

The Board is seeking input from the community on this issue. Please submit your written thoughts to the NSCA office and management will provide them to the Board for review. The deadline for written comments will be May 31. Ultimately, the Board will have to make the final determination on what replacement material to be used.

- 3. Accepted bid from Reserve Data Analysis to perform comprehensive reserve analysis for the 1996 budget. Cost will be \$1795.
- Accepted the draft of the 1994 audit by Jim Zimmermann, completed Authorized management to have audit printed and mailed to all homeowners by April 30, 1995.
- 5. Authorized management to obtain a second truckload of playmix (wood chips) for the tot lot. Cost will be approximately \$600.

To hold the meeting, we must have 480 homes represented in person or by proxy!


If the meeting cannot be held on May 16, the meeting will then be held on Wednesday, May 17, 8 pm.

VACATION HOME SECURITY CHECK

At no cost to residents of the City of Dana Point, Police Services will provide vacation home checks while residents are out of town.

They will provide a physical check of a residence to insure no windows or doors have been left open, etc.

When residents require a vacation home check, they are to call the Laguna Niguel Sheriff Substation at 249-5200 and give the following information:

- * Name, address, cross street, from what date to what date they require the service.
- * Who to contact in case of an emergency (name, address, city, area plus telephone number and relationship) and whether this person has a key to the home.
- * Any other information such as a gardener who comes on what day of the week, any pets, name of anyone who will have access to the home during the resident's absence, any car left in the driveway (license, make, color), and any other information which will help secure the home.

COMMUNITY CENTER RULES

The summer season is here again and the community center will again be buzzing with activity. As a reminder, here are a few rules for using the community center:

COMMUNITY CENTER

All persons using the facilities MUST sign in. No pets allowed.

No bikes, skateboards, or skates allowed.

No glass containers.

Proof of membership or guest status may be required.

Guests using the facilities must be accompanied by a resident, or be registered at the office by the resident.

SWIMMING POOL

No one under 14 years of age allowed in pool area without parent or lifeguard supervision.

Adult swim only from 7 am to 9 am and 12 pm to 1 pm. No children in pool area during this time.

Shower before entering the pool.

Hair at or below shoulder length must be banded.

No food or gum in pool area.

No floating apparatus or objects of any kind are permitted in pool.

Swim suits must be worn in pool.

JACUZZI

No one under 18 years of age allowed in jacuzzi area. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Shower before entering jacuzzi.

No smoking in jacuzzi area.

No food or beverage in jacuzzi area.

STREET SWEEPING SCHEDULE

The scheduled date for street sweeping this month is Monday, May 1. You are requested to have your vehicles off the streets and out of the parking bays. This will allow the sweeper to do a better job.

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE UPDATE

During the month of May, the following projects will be started:

- 1. The English Primrose will be removed throughout the Association and Impatiens planted as our summer color. These plants should last into November.
- 2. <u>Custom Homes</u> The concrete downdrains along Breakers Isle will receive plantings to mask them. Several bare areas on the slope below Breakers Isle will receive new plants.
- 3. <u>Atlantic Garden Homes</u> Several old eucalyptus trees along Atlantic Dr. to be removed. Replacement trees will be Melaleucas.
- 4. <u>Shores Garden Homes</u> Several homes front yards will receive replacement shrubs and ground cover.
- 5. <u>Villas</u> The utility box on Vista D'Oro will be planted to mask it.
- 6. <u>Sea Terrace II</u> Add ten medium size trees to the bottom of the slope, below the Villas, within the Gourami greenbelt.



MENS CLUB GOLF


