
On April 18th, Bill Misner, Professional Community Management and Frank Mead, the laison Director for the Board to landscape maintenance called a meeting on behalf of landscape improvements with the landscape consultant for P.C.M., Mr. Jack Wilkinson the current landscape maintenance sub-contractor and Mr. Harry Otsubo, a resident who is a professional landscaper.

As a result of detailed inspections made throughout the community, problems were discussed and many solutions were suggested. A formal basic program was drafted as a result of this meeting and is gradually being implemented throughout the community. And additional foreman has been hired to inspect and operate our sprinkler systems. Weeding schedules are posted with the Association Manager on a monthly basis. A pruning and thinning policy has been established by the interpretation of the Landscape Architects original intent for Niguel Shores. Grass and lawn areas have been raised to a height of 2½" in order that they will stay greener longer with less fertilizer. Three power driven machines mowers have been purchased in order to give crews one additional day in the community for weeding and detailed

It just seem like just a short time ago that summer camp children threw me into the pool on the last day of camp, and now its time to begin our second summer at Niguel Shores Community Center.







Charlie Gibbs of Underwater Educators will return to Niguel Shores to repeat the very successful Scuba Class he conducted last summer. Three classes will be offered, beginner, refresher, and advanced.

The refresher course is offered for all those who have a NAUI or PADI certification card, and would like to review their diving skills. The class will meet in the Community Center pool on June 10th & 17th, and will have a beach dive on Sunday, June 30th. Cost of the class is \$25.00.
