


Dear Homeowner,

Morning adult lessons, 16 and older, will meet one hour each Wednesday starting June 22nd for eight weeks. In order to get as many men as interested, the Advanced class will meet at 8:00AM, followed by the Intermediate at 9:00 AM, Advanced Beginners at 10:00 and Beginners at 11:00. Enrollment is limited to 10 people per class

EXCERPTS FROM THE C C & R's

page 1

- 1. Animals. No animals, fowl, reptiles or poultry shall be kept within Niguel Shroes, except that domestic dogs, cats, birds, and fish may be kept as household pets upon said property provided that they are not kept, bred, or raised thereon for commercial purposes or in unreasonable quantities. (IX:11)
- 2. Antennas. No outside television or radio pole or antenna or other electronic device shall be constructed, erected or maintained on any building or on any property within Niguel Shores or connected in such manner as to be visible from the outside of any such building. (IX:5)
- 3. <u>Buildings</u>. All buildings and othere structures upon Niguel Shores and each portion thereof shall at all times be maintained in good condition and repair and well and properly painted. (IX:16)
- 4. Garages. When garages are not in use, garage doors shall be closed. No open carport shall be used for the storage of any item other than an automobile. (IX:6)
- Improvements. No fence, wall, building, or other structure, 5. or exterior addition to or change or alteration thereof (including painting), shall be commenced, constructed, erected, placed, altered, maintained or permitted to remain on any of the real property within Niguel Shores (including Common Areas) until plans and specifications showing plot layour and all exterior elevations, with materials and colors therefor and structural design and landscaping, shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by an architectural committee. All such plans and specifications shall be submitted in writing over the signature of the Owner of the property or its authorized agent. Approval shall be based, among other things, on adequacy of site dimensions; adequacy of structural design and material; conformity and harmony of external design with neighboring structures; effect of location and use of improvements on neighboring property, improvements, operations and uses; relation of topography, grade and finished ground elevation of the property being improved to that of neighboring property; proper facing of main elevations with respect to nearby streets; preservation of natural view and esthetic beauty; and conformity of the plans and specifications to the purpose and general plan and intent of this Declaration. (VII:1)

No building, structure, or improvement shall be constructed, erected, altered, placed or permitted to remain on any Lot in Niguel Shores in such location or manner as will unreasonably obstruct or interfere with the view of any other Lot. No projections of any type shall be placed or permitted to remain above the roof of any residential building with the exception of one or more chimneys and one or more vent stacks. (IX:5)

6. Landscaping. No shrub which at maturity and without pruning thereof would exceed three feet in height, tree or hedge shall be planted or placed on any of the real property within Niguel Shores until plans and specifications showing the type of shrub, tree or hedge and the proposed location and elevation thereof (including the location and elevation of same in relation to neighboring property) shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by such architectural committee. The architectural committee shall have the right to require any Member to remove, trim, top, or prune any shrub, tree, or hedge which such committee reasonably believes impedes the view of any Lot. (VII:1)

All landscaping of every kind and character, including shrubs, trees, grass, and other plantings shall be neatly trimmed properly cultivated and maintained continuously by the Owner thereof in a neat and orderly condition and in a manner to enhance its appearance. (IX:18)

No tree, shrub or planting of any kind shall be allowed to overhang or otherwise encroach upon any sidewalk or other pedestrian way from ground level to a height of ten(10) feet without the prior approval of the architectural committee. (IX:19)

- 7. Nuisance. No noxious or offensive trade or activity shall be carried on upon any portion of Niguel Shores, nor shall anything be done or maintained thereon which may be or become an annoyance or nuisance to the neighborhood. (IX:15)
- 8. Rubbish. No weeds, rubbish, debris, objects or materials of any kind shall be placed or permitted to accumulate upon any portion of Niguel Shores which render such portion unsanitary, unsightly, offensive or detrimental to any property in the vicinity thereof or to the occupants of any such property in such vicinity. In the event of the default in the performance of this provision, and if such default shall not have been cured within five (5) days after written notice thereof, the Association shall have the right to enter upon said property and remove all weed, rubbish, debris, objects or materials and do all things necessary to place said property in a neat and orderly condition and any expenses therefor shall become due and payable from the Owner of said property to the Association within five (5) days after written demand therefor. (IX:12)
- 9. Service Yards. All service yards or service areas, clothes-line areas, rubbish containers, and storage piles on any property within Niguel Shores shall be enclosed or fenced in such a manner that such yards, areas, containers, equipment, and piles will be obstructed from view from any neighboring property or street. (IX:14)

- 10. Signs. Except for a sign colored black and white, having a maximum face area of three square feet, and advertising the property for sale, no sign or other advertising device of any character shall be erected, maintained, or displayed upon any portion of Niguel Shores. (IX:10)
- 11. Slopes. Slope areas shall be maintained continuously by the Owner thereof in a neat and orderly condition and in such a manner as to enhance its appearance, maintain established slope ratios, prevent erosion or sliding problems, and to facilitate the orderly discharge of water through drainage systems. No structure, planting or other material shall be placed or permitted to remain, or other activities undertaken on slope control areas or other slope areas, which might damage or interfere with established slope ratios, create erosion or sliding problems, or interfere with established drainage functions or facilities. (IX:17)
- 12. Trucks. No mobile home, boat, truck or trailer of any kind shall be kept, stored, parked, maintained, constructed or repaired, on any property or street within Niguel Shores in such a manner as to be visible from any neighboring property; provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not apply to emergency vehicle repairs. (IX:8)
