Are you interested in aerobic fitness?
What is aerobic fitness?
What are the payoffs of aerobic fitness?

Aerobic exercise helps by getting more blood to the heart to provide it with oxygen and nourishment, improving its ability to function as a pump. It works to slow the resting heart rate and lowers blood pressure. Exercise lowers blood cholesteral and other fats in the blood and improves metabolizing the sugar.

Other physical benefits are firmer body muscles and helps in lowering body weight.

Aerobic exercise reduces tension and other effects of stress.

What is aerobic exercise? Exercise that can be carried on continuously for 20 or more minutes, a steady non-stop activity. Examples: swimming, jogging, calesthenics. Examples do not include tennis and golf which are considered anaerobic or short in duration, stop and go in rhythm and low intensity in effort.







NIGUEL SHORES COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS

COMMITTEE DECISION APPEAL PROCESS

Any owner of real property who has made application to any committee of the Association may appeal the decision of the committee to the Board of Directors, as follows:

- 1. Give written notice to the Board of such appeal, including the following information:
 - a. Name, address, telephone number of owner.
 - b. Legal address of real property affected, if any.
 - c. Name of committee to which application was made.
 - d. Date of application to committee.
 - e. Date of committee action.
 - f. Committee's decision.
 - g. Owner's statement, in detail, of the purpose of his/her application to the committee.
- 2. A hearing shall be set by the Board of Directors not more than thirty (30) days from the date of receipt by the Board of the owner's notice of appeal. The meeting shall be held at the Association office.
- 3. The Board shall give notice to other interested parties not less than ten (10) days prior to the date of such hearing.
- 4. The owner shall have the right to representation of his/her choice, including legal counsel.
- 5. The hearing may be open or closed, at the discretion of the owner.
- 6. The hearing may be recorded at the discretion of the owner.

 The cost of such recording and the preparation of any transcript from a recording shall be borne by the owner.
- 7. Prior to the hearing the owner shall have access to all relevant and material Association records.
- 8. The owner shall have the opportunity to cross-examine any witness presented by the Association.
- The owner shall have an opportunity to present evidence at the hearing.
- 10. The Board's determination after hearing shall be in writing, setting the reason(s) for such determination.

NIGL__ SHORES COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS

REALTOR ENTRY

When property in Niguel Shores is for sale or rent, real estate agents and prospective purchasers or tenants will be granted entry only as follows:

1. OWNER CALL-IN

- a. Mariner Entrance: The property owner may call the Mariner gate to authorize entry for a specific agent/client on the day the property is to be shown.
- b. Manta or Garibaldi Entrances: Owners in The Villas and Sea Terrace II must receive the agent's call on arrival at the gate and execute gate entry procedures.

2. LETTER OF AUTHORIZATION

Property owners may authorize admittance in the owner's absence, until the property is sold or rented, by submitting a Letter of Authorization to the Association office. The letter shall include the owner's name, address of the property listed, and shall designate the specific real estate agent or firm to be admitted. If the property is on a multiple listing and the owner wishes all real estate agents to be admitted upon proper identification, the letter must so state.

- a. Mariner Entrance: Each entry must be cleared through the Association office. Office personnel will verify authorization from the letter on file and will notify the security officer to permit entry.
- b. Manta or Garibaldi Entrances: After entrance authorization has been verified, agents may borrow a key card from the Association office. The agent's Department of Real Estate identification card will be retained in the Association office until return of the key card.

3. IDENTIFICATION

Each agent will be required to show the Security officer his/her Department of Real Estate identification card and to present a real estate business card, on which has been written the date of visit and address of property to be shown. Only that property shall be shown for which authorization has been granted.

4. CARAVANS

Caravans are permitted within Niguel Shores on Friday mornings only, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 12 Noon. Drivers of caravan vehicles must present identification as above.

NIGUEL SHORES COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS

VEHICLES

- 1. The speed limit within Niguel Shores shall be no more than 25 MPH.
- 2. All stop signs and other traffic directories shall be observed.
- 3. All vehicles operating within Niguel Shores shall be duly licensed and operating as required by the California Vehicle Code, and shall be driven by legally licensed drivers.
- 4. All vehicles operating or parked within Niguel Shores shall bear a current decal or pass, except that vehicles of guests within those portions of the community served by the Manta and Garibaldi gates shall not be required to display a pass.
- 5. No parking is permitted in any red or yellow zone, on a sidewalk, or in any manner that would block a driveway or create a traffic or safety hazard.
- 6. No vehicle, including motorcycles or mopeds, shall be operated on walkways or areas other than streets.
- 7. Guest parking shall not be used for overnight parking of resident vehicles, except that when the number of vehicles owned by a resident is such that no additional vehicles may be parked in the resident's garage or driveway, then such vehicles may be parked in guest parking spaces.
- 8. Visitors shall not park in those areas in the beach parking lot designated for use by residents only.
- 9. Street parking is prohibited in cul de sac streets except in designated parking spaces.
- 10. No vehicle shall be repaired or serviced on the streets or in designated parking areas except that repairs of an emergency nature only shall be permitted.

NIGUEL SHORES COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS

RUBBISH-DEBRIS

- 1. Littering, disposal of trash, grass, clippings or other debris on or around the common areas and facilities is prohibitted.
- 2. Except as provided below, rubbish containers shall be enclosed or fenced so as to be obstructed from view of any neighboring property or street.
- 3. Rubbish containers shall not be placed out for pick up by the disposal company more than twelve hours before nor left out more than twelve hours after scheduled pick up.
- 4. Rubbish containers shall not be placed out earlier than the evening before not left out longer than the evening of scheduled pick up.
- 5. Trash and rubbish are to be put in containers adequate to protect from animals and the elements.

C. SERVICE PASSES

- 1. Service passes may be issued to service personnel, resident and community, i.e. contractors, housekeepers, nurses, gardners, pool service employees, etc., upon completion of the Service Pass registration form, satisfactory identification (drivers license and vehicle registration), and authorization by the owner or resident.
- 2. Service passes are valid for up to six months, and may be renewed upon reauthorization by owner or resident and completion of an up-dated Service Pass registration form. Expired Service Passes must be returned prior to issuance of new pass.
- 3. NOTE: OWNERS AND RESIDENTS SHALL NOTIFY N.S.C.A. OFFICE WHEN SERVICE PERSONNEL ARE TERMINATED.

VIII. "NO CALL" LIST

- A. RESIDENT PROPERTY OWNERS AND REGISTERED TENANTS may authorize admittance of regular visitors without prior call to the security gate, by submitting written authorization to the Association office on the "Visitor No Call List."
- B. A maximum of <u>four</u> such authorizations shall be permitted per property address at any one time.
- C. Revisions to the Visitor No call List shall cancel all previous authorizations.
- D. Authorizations must be signed by the OWNER(s) OF RECORD OR REGISTERED TENANT.
- E. Visitors on the Visitor No call List will be issued a Visitor Day Pass by the security guard, which shall be displayed in the vehicle while in the community.
- F. RESIDENTS SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED ENTRY BY "NO CALL" AUTHORIZATION.
