Next Board Meeting for Committee Reports

Discussion on whether to remove speed bumps from locations that adjoin stop signs

#### JUNE BOARD ACTIONS

- 1. Accepted the resignation of Buck Ewing from the Landscape Committee.
- 2. Decided that management is to use the Post Office envelope cancellation date on homeowner quarterly assessment payments to determine whether a late charge is to be applied.
- 3. Authorized management to reimburse a homeowner \$145 for blocked sewer line attributable to common area tree roots.
- 4. Informed management not to install a manual gate arm for the visitor, lane at Mariner gate. The installation was previously authorized by the prior Board.
- 5. Formally disbanded the Community Relations Committee at their request. The committee no longer exists as of June 15, 1994.
- 6. Reappointed all of the previous Committee Chairpersons for 94-95:

Architectural - Lee Richards Communication - John Dickerhoff

Finance - Andy Boush

Landscape - Bob Theel/Eve Magnus

Maintenance - Rick Foth
Recreation - Dick Luedeke
Traffic/Safety- Pat Long
Tree View - Carroll Cox

- 7. Approved the dates submitted by the Recreation Committee for Steak Fry/Community Fair (September 17) and Art-Affaire (November 12 & 13).
- 8. Turned down the request to install a refrigerated water fountain near the tennis courts because of high cost to purchase and install.
- 9. Authorized management to contract with M.C. Gregg Painting for the painting of the IPR Kitchen cabinets/drawers. Cost will be \$700.

- 10. Authorized management to purchase two or three concrete trash containers for Community Center/beach bluff areas. The amount of \$1200 was budgeted in current year's budget.
- 11. Authorized management to replace the wood in the women's sauna room at projected cost of \$800. This work is necessary because of vandalism.
- 12. Authorized management to purchase a gaspowered generator for the maintenance staff. Cost should not exceed \$500.

# TOPIC AT NEXT OPEN MEETING - SHOULD THE BOARD EXPEND FUNDS TO REMOVE SPEED BUMPS ?

The Traffic and Safety Committee has requested that approximately fifteen speed bumps be removed. These bumps are near intersections controlled by stop signs or other control device.

The cost to remove the bumps and fill in with new asphalt will be approximately \$3,000.

The Board would like to receive homeowner input at the July 20 Board meeting. Interested homeowners may come to the meeting at 8 pm or send correspondence to the NSCA office. Copies of all letters/notes received will be provided to the Board prior to the meeting.

# IDEAS FOR 4TH OF JULY SANDCASTLE CONTEST

- 3. Pack the sand hard and keep it as wet as possible.

#### LANDSCAPE UPDATE

Some of you may have noticed that many of the Evergreen Pear trees throughout the community have dead branches or leaves. This condition is known as "blight." Wendt Landscaping will begin trimming all of the Pear trees to remove the blight. It is hoped that this will stop or at least slow down this condition.

The project for the Selva and LaCresta common area slopes (Sea Terrace II) is on hold. Additional consideration by the Board of Directors on the merits of this work has been requested by the Landscape Committee Co-Chairpersons.

Many privately employed landscape workmen are gaining access to the rear yards of homes by walking up the rear slope. This continued foot traffic on the slope causes damage to the slope and vegetation. If this problem continues, the Landscape Committee may have to ask the Board to authorize repairs to the slopes and to bill the costs to the homeowner that allows the landscape contractor to use the slope for access.

Projects to begin in July:

Broadmoor: Refurbishment of a slope section on Windlass.

Sea Terrace I: Continue front yard refurbishment program on Marlinspike.

Shores Garden Homes: Misc. replanting throughout the area.

### HOLIDAYS CHANGE TRASH PICKUP SCHEDULE

Many residents don't understand the postholiday trash pickup schedule.

On Tuesday, June 3 and Thursday, June 5, some 70% of Shores residents had their barrels out in the street. There was no pickup on those days. Reason: Monday of that week was Memorial Day and a major holiday just before pickup postpones service one day. In this case, collection was Wednesday June 4 and Friday, June 6.

Here are the major holidays:

New Year's Day

Memorial Day

Independence Day

Labor Day

Thanksgiving

Christmas

Secondary holidays (e.g. Columbus Day, President's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Veterans Day) do not affect the schedule.

Half of the major holidays always fall on a Monday, which means trash pickup those weeks vill always be postponed from Tuesday to Wednesday and Thursday to Friday respectively. Thanksgiving is always on a Thursday, so service will be the next day but that will not affect the following Tuesday's normal schedule for residents living on the south side of Selva.

The holidays that are eternally on an express day (e.g. December 25) can be a trifle different. If the holiday is on any of the five normal work days, pickup is postponed one day. (If the holiday is on a Friday, service will be on Saturday.) If the holiday is on a Saturday or Sunday, there is no change in schedule.

Please keep this article for reference, so our beautiful community can have a few unsightly trash-out days as possible.




