Generally, most of us are accustomed to the procedure for telephoning the Mariner Gate to arrange for day gate vehicle passes to be picked up by our guests, contractors or services providers. Early in June we began a new procedure that should speed the process. Normally, the pass procedure will no longer require the use of a computer data base to enter and retrieve needed information. residents now wanting to authorize issuance of vehicle gate passes will be asked to provide their last name, the name of their street and the name of their guest. This information will be hand printed directly onto the guest pass which will be filed alphabetically, according to the last name of the resident, awaiting the arrival of the guest.

We have noted that admittance of guests has speeded up. However, residents can help the gate attendant on duty greatly, by whenever possible, calling the gate in the early afternoon and after 8 pm, rather than peak guest entry periods, which are from 7 am to after the lunch hour, and the after work or the early evening and dinner hours. On average, more than 400 gate passes are prepared daily, but about 20% of the guests never arrive. Avoidance of this unnecessary pass preparation effort would allow the gate attendant to be more responsive to guests who do arrive and to more quickly answer the telephone.

Surprisingly, some contractors or services providers, and even guests arrive at the Mariner Gate and do not know or cannot remember the name of the resident they have come to see. Obviously, these guests cannot be admitted as the attendant at the gate does not know the name of the resident. This baffling problem can be avoided by guests having the name, address and phone number of the resident in writing.

At this time of year the telephone number at the Mariner Gate is routinely changed. Unluckily, there was nothing routine about what resulted after these arrangements were attempted on the 16th of June. Rather than the change taking place on July 1, with both the new number and the old telephone numbers operative for two weeks, the telephone company canceled the old number and activated the new number. To make matters worse, when we learned about the problem Sunday morning, there was no one at the phone company that could make the necessary corrections. However, this was accomplished by noon Monday, and we regret the inconvenience that this caused residents and their guests. By the time you read this, you should have received a letter containing information about the new phone number that you should being using on July 11.

BOARD ACTIONS TAKEN IN JUNE

- 1. Agreed to fund one-third (\$500) of the estimated cost for the children's summer program proposed by the Recreation Committee. Parents of participants have agreed to pay \$1,000 towards this program.
- 2. Accepted dates from the Recreation Committee for the following events:
 - 1. Steak Dinner/Country Fair September 16

- 3. Authorized management to have Pace Printing, Anaheim, handle our new guest pass/service pass printing at the cost of \$218 per 6000 passes.

- 7. Authorized management to purchase two(2) Motorola replacement radios for Maintenance staff and a new computer for Mariner gate.
- 8. Appointed Forrest Owen to the Architectural Committee.

- 10. Accepted the bid from Court Concepts to strip the tennis courts and apply new surface. Cost for work, \$11,100. Work will most likely take place in September.

RESIDENTS ARE ASKED TO BE UNDERSTANDING AND COOPERATIVE WITH PERSONNEL AT MARINER GATE

Last month, a very long article appeared describing problems at the gate and a new type of guest/service pass that will be used. The change to the new system seems to be working better than the old system; however, there are still some problems that need to be resolved with residents help and support.

This new system has shown just how busy the gate phone really is. Currently, the gate is receiving an average of 430 calls a day from residents authorizing passes. Within a 24 hour period, this averages out to once every three minutes. However, the gate is only handing out approximately 355 each day! There are approximately 75 written passes per day that are not handed out.

If the gate receives a phone call an average of every three minutes, and it may take two minutes to write and file the new pass, there is very little time left over to greet visitors, find a filed pass or search the computer for a resident's "no call list", give visitors directions and monitor the resident's decal lane.

RESIDENTS CAN HELP WITH THE FOLLOWING:

It will greatly help Mariner gate for residents to review the rules and see if your guest/service provider can qualify for another pass that can be written by the office. Guests staying at a home for three to thirty days can receive a Special Entry Permit with the residents authorization. Service providers can receive either extended or limited time service permits, which must also have resident authorization. Those coming through the gate with issued permits by the office will speed the entrance procedures.

Another area that residents can assist with is making sure the guest/service provider knows the NAME and NIGUEL SHORES PROPERTY ADDRESS of the person they are seeing. Many times people show up at the gate and assume they will automatically be admitted just by

telling the personnel they are going to a friends house and the resident has already called in. Without the above information, it is nearly impossible to find a pass, because they are filed by the resident's last name. Entry will most likely be denied, so to save embarrassment and lessen the load on the gate, your name and Niguel Shores address must be known by the guest/service provider.

Try to limit giving the gate officer more than two names when you call and provide your address. Also, it will greatly help if calls are made by residents at slow times during the day, such as: before 7 am, early afternoon or after 8:00 pm at night. The worst time to call is 7 am to 1 pm, especially Monday through Friday.

Your assistance with the above will lessen the load on the gate personnel and speed the entry of visitors to your homes.

REMINDER - POSTED AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER IS LIST OF HOMEOWNERS PROPOSING SPACE ADDITIONS OR ROOF LINE CHANGES

Under a new procedure established this year by the Board of Directors, staff will post in a glass case near the main entry to the Community Center those homeowners who have recently submitted to the Architectural Committee for either a space addition or roof line change. The posting will contain the deadline date homeowners have to submit written comments for review by the Architectural Committee. Once the Committee has reviewed the plans and made a decision, comments cannot be considered.

Homeowners interested in reviewing the plans on file must contact the office staff, Monday through Friday, 9 am to 4:30 pm. It is best to call the office and speak with Jeanette Federico prior to coming in. Homeowners will be allowed to review the plot plan and all exterior elevation drawings. Interior plans are not available for review, because the Board respects homeowner privacy.

HOMEOWNER REMINDER - ASSESSMENT PAYMENT DUE ON TIME EVEN IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE BILLING STATEMENT

Homeowners are reminded that a billing statement is sent out four times per year for the quarterly installment: January 1, April 1, July 1 and. October 1. These statements are always mailed out by our service bureau during the week preceding the due date.

WHETHER OR NOT YOU RECEIVE THIS STATEMENT IS IMMATERIAL; THE QUARTERLY ASSESSMENT MUST BE PAID WITHIN THE TIME ALLOTTED OR A LATE CHARGE WILL BE APPLIED.


You should check to see if you have received your statement by the seventh of the month due. If you have not, please contact Ivy in the NSCA office and request a duplicate to be mailed. The office staff will see that one is mailed out within two days of being notified.

For the next assessment due on July 1, the statements should be in the mail by June 27. A late charge will be assessed if payment is not postmarked by July 30, 1995.

NOTES FROM THE RECREATION COMMITTEE


