

All residents are encouraged to report all acts of disorder or suspicion to the Orange County Sheriff, (834-3000) and Professional Community Management, (830-8040). Residents are especially encouraged to cooperate with security guards and patrolman in the protection of their communities, by reporting as noted above as well as not breaking their own gates.

Breaking a gate is an act of malicious mischief and will be immediately turned over the the Orange County Sheriff for assistance in collecting a \$25.00 fine for damages to community owned property. Your assistance, cooperation, and watchful eyes are greatly appreciated by our local authorities and in the long "run" the entire community.




