As this is the first opportunity I have to speak to you as your new President, I would like to thank all of you for participating in our recent elections, either in person or by proxy. By voting, you have exercised your power of choice in electing representatives to your Board. In this manner, the community association truly becomes a very close-at-hand form of democratic government. As your new President, I hope to put in force a representative Board, and committees as well. I feel that all residents will best be served by homeowner committees who will study the association's problems, and make positive, plausible recommendations to the Board for their consideration.

The first such committee has already been formed - Security. At a meeting held in the Center on August 23rd, eight people were elected by homeowners to serve on the Security Committee. After a short caucus, they elected Bob Chandler as their Chairman, Art Powell as Assistant Chairman, and Josephine Dominic as Secretary. September 20th - Finance September 25th - Maintenance September 27th - Planning






HANDBALL AT LAST!

- 2. All 12 year olds or seventh graders will be able to enjoy all all pool privileges.
- 3. House guests may be registered in the Center office by a resident. Guests may enjoy all the facilities of the Center. They may be registered for two consecutive one week terms.
- 4. Adult Swim hours are 0:00-8:00 PM Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The pool is reserved for adult swimmers only at these times. Adults are persons 18 years old or older.

NIGUEL SHORES COMMUNITY CENTER




