Shores Gate: With the completion of the change of equipment at the Shores Gate, residents are cautioned; that when using the exit, not to proceed until the arm has reached the up-right position and the green light has come on. 

Any in-put from members elative to recommended expenditures or community needs should be irected through the appropriate committee, i.e., Recreation, equrity, Landscape and Maintenance, etc.

RECYCLING PROGRAM

Our recycling program has settled down to a steady flow of paper and aluminum. Our residents seem to prefer our new self-delivery system and very few "bugs" have developed.

One problem exists which must be corrected. Papers should be contained in the large grocery bags, or rightly tied in bundles. If cartons are used, they should not be overfilled and the tops should be folded over so that paper will not spill out. Also,



when delivering your paper, please ALWAYS STACK TO THE REAR AND AS HIGH AS POSSIBLE BEFORE STARTING A NEW ROW!!! Properly stacked, the shed will hold 8 to 8-1/2 tonsimproperly stacked, it can only hold 5 to 6 tons.

The aluminum bin will hold three times as many compacted (smashed) cans as it will non-smashed cans. Therefore, please smash before stashing.

A financial report will appear at 90-day intervals. Niguel Shores Men's Club has sponsored the recycling program for our community. All funds are used only in a way that benefits the entire community. Complete records are kept and funds are in an interest-bearing checking account.

Residents who support the program are participating in a patriotic move to conserve our timberlands and bauxite mined for the manufacture of aluminum while providing additional benefits for our Community such as our continuing program of street sign maintenance.

Thou shalt bear in mind that tennis is only a game, and when thine reflexes have diminished, and thine bones begin to creak, and thy eyesight begins to fail......


