BOARD ACTIONS FOR AUGUST

- 1. Authorized management to change to a different pager company if cost is less than current monthly cost.
- Authorized management to reimburse 2. homeowner for tire damage involving the Garibaldi gate. Cost \$303.29.
- 3. Denied request from homeowner asking for reimbursement of \$2396 for multiple repairs to sewer line coming from home.
- Decided not to pursue removal of fifteen speed bumps throughout the community.
- Received homeowner petition for the addition of one speed bump on Periwinkle. Board is still considering whether to install the requested bump.
- 6. Directed management to continue removing escallonia shrubs on the Selva and La Cresta Sea Terrace II slopes. This was on the advice of our soils engineering consultant. Shrubs will be replaced with oleander.

Lynn will be using a color slide projector showing the concept drawings for each entry/exit gate area and the suggested landscaping to accompany the new hardscape. This design is the culmination of many months of work in 1993 by the committee chaired by Tom Reath.

The meeting is a presentation ONLY! There will not be any decisions made by the Board or homeowners. It is expected by the Board that there will be at least one additional community meeting that will occur in either October or November for discussion on this comprehensive project.

RESIDENTS/HOMEOWNERS ARE ADVISED TO USE GARAGE FOR PARKING VEHICLES, NOT STORING POSSESSIONS

It has become evident through observation of open garages that many residents/homeowners are using their garage for storing possessions, not their vehicles. It is the Board of Directors position that every resident/homeowner is to use their garage and driveway for parking of vehicles. Rule 6505 states:

> Visitor parking spaces in the common areas shall not be used for overnight parking of resident/homeowner vehicles except when the number of vehicles owned by a resident/homeowner and properly registered...is such that no additional vehicles could be parked in the resident's garage or driveway...then such vehicles may be parked in visitor parking spaces or on the street.

The Board has directed management to see that the patrol service begin citing vehicles with decals using common area parking or street spaces for overnight parking. Those found to be in violation will be issued a warning letter and after a second violation a hearing letter will be The Board will then determine at the hearing whether a fine should be issued that will range from \$25 to \$50. A third violation may result in a fine between \$25 to \$100.

For those that have more than two vehicles, you should begin to clean out your garage or see that all vehicles can park on your driveway. If you currently use your garage for business, you should move your business into your home. This is very important for those who do not have a driveway.

Your cooperation will be appreciated by the Board and your neighbors.

COMMUNITY POOL MAINTENANCE

The Board of Directors wants to acknowledge receiving a petition through the Recreation Committee about the condition of the pool. Steps to change some of the maintenance procedures were already in process prior to receiving the complaints.


The pool will be closed for maintenance from 9 am to 10 am on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, year round. This is necessary so that proper vacuuming can be accomplished, tile cleaned and the pool deck washed off. During this past summer, there has been a tremendous load on the pool and the constant use from 7 am to after 9 pm made maintenance difficult.

There has been some misinformation circulating about the cloudy look of the water. This is not a result of poor chemical balance, but rather filtration. During the last several weeks, the pool filtration has been running 24 hours per day trying to keep up. Our chemical balance is acceptable as verified by the O.C. Health Department on August 17. A pool inspector made a surprise inspection and this pool passed and is considered clean.

Pool equipment modifications will be made this fall to improve filtration during high use periods and allow us to run the equipment no more than 18 hours per day during summer months.

There is one thing homeowners, residents and their guests can do to help with one particular maintenance problem:

> ALWAYS WASH OFF THE SAND FROM THE BEACH BEFORE GOING INTO THE POOL AREA, USING THE SHOWER.


