FROM THE HELM

Happy New Year! I can hardly believe it's 1999. This will be a special year in many ways, and special for Niguel Shores, too.

On Monday, January 11, our contractor is scheduled to start work on the Mariner Gate.

After several meetings concerning the schedule, we've determined that Mariner Drive will need to be closed to both in and out traffic for three weeks. First of all, this is for safety reasons and, secondly, if we try to let some traffic through, it will make the project last longer and cost more.

Mariner Drive will be closed from January 18 to February 8. Residents can use either Selva Gate or Ports O'Call/Cabrillo Gate. Visitors must use the Selva Gate. During this time period, if residents are expecting a delivery truck or a moving van, please direct them to Ports O'Call/Cabrillo Gate entries. You must notify the NSCA office of the date and time of arrival. The Office will arrange for someone to meet the truck and allow entry. Large trucks or moving vans will have a difficult time entering through the Selva Gate.

Emergency vehicles will have access through the Ports O'Call/Cabrillo and Selva gates, 24 hours a day.

Selva Gate will be locked open twenty-four hours a day. Part of the time we will have a

patrol officer there to monitor entering vehicles. Part of the time the patrol officer will provide extra patrol service.

Two things are very important. Number one: Tell your guests and your regular visitors, such as gardeners, to use the Selva Gate between January 18 to February 8. This will minimize the confusion at the intersection of Niguel Road and Mariner Drive. Number two: If you are concerned about any suspicious vehicles, call 770-6011 for assistance from the sheriff.

During the three-week closure, paving will be removed and replaced, trenches will be dug across the roadway and piping and conduit will be placed, new curbing will be poured, and the foundation for the new sentry house will be poured. After February 8 there may be intermittent delays as the sentry house is completed and the gates are installed. The contractor is scheduled to be finished by the end of March.

Of course, all this depends on reasonably good weather.

We're sorry for any inconvenience, but we feel this time of the year is the best for this project since we have less traffic through Mariner Gate in the first quarter of the year than at any other time. We're sure that the new gate will be worth it.

DECEMBER BOARD ACTIONS

- ✓ Authorized the increase in cost for the repairs/replacement of the Villas/Sea Terrace II stairs. New cost will be approximately \$4,658.
- ✓ Accepted Bobbe Kahn's resignation from the Architectural Committee and John Kizarr's resignation from the Communication Committee.
- ✓ Authorized staff to install a speed bump before vehicles exit through Selva Gate.
- ✓ Authorized the Traffic & Safety Committee to offer a reward for information leading to prosecution of individual(s) vandalizing Association property. The Committee can recommend to the Board a reward up to \$500.
- ✓ Directed the Controller to transfer all 1998 excess operating funds to the Mariner Gate reserve fund.
- ✓ Accepted the proposal from Dale Hadfield, ASLA, to re-design the Mariner Gate entry landscape. Cost for his services will be \$1,300.
- ✓ Accepted the bid from Morgan Augustus Masonry, amounting to \$3,305, to repair two locations with sidewalk damage caused by pine trees.
- ✓ Accepted proposal from Ib Christian Abel Architects to prepare a second conceptual redesign of the Ports O'Call/Cabrillo Isle entry/exit gates for the Board to review and consider. Cost is not to exceed \$2,000.

BEACH PEDESTRIAN GATE LOCKING DEVICE TO BE REACTIVATED - JANUARY 4TH

Residents should be aware that the gate locking device will be <u>re-activated on Monday</u>. <u>January 4 at 9:00 am</u> You will need to have your proximity gate card or proximity key fob to pass through the gate.

The panel with the proximity locking device has been re-designed. You will be able to see the LED lights on top of the proximity device. Pass your key card or key fob over the glass panel as close to the proximity device as possible. When the device reads an activated card/fob, you should receive a "green" light and be able to open the gate. If there is a "red" light you cannot open the gate; wait 10 seconds and try again. If after several tries you still cannot get the device to open the gate, please come to the office, Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 5:00 p.m. Bring your card/fob, and ask the staff to check it.



LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Beach grass area is very brown and ugly and is typical of Bermuda grass at this time of year. The grass could be re-seeded with rye grass for the winter to have pleasant green grass but, with our present rabbit problem we would be growing rabbit food.

If you have noticed that the new impatiens plants and the poinsettias look dry and wilted, it is not from lack of water. Unfortunately we had frost and they have frostbite. We will replace those that we cannot save.

After Christmas Wendt Landscape will begin de-thatch work throughout most of the community. The front yards in Sea Terrace I were previously done, approximately one year ago, thus they are not included. Wendt will perform de-thatching in the Sea Terrace II front yards.

Please remember that the turf will look brown and unattractive. The turf will be fertilized at the end of the work and the turf should "green" up in several weeks, depending on the weather.

A short history about the Atlantic Garden pine trees follows. These beautiful trees were originally planted by the developer and are considered a real asset to the community. Because of the size and shape they become when they mature, there have been problems of view blockage, sidewalk and curb damage, and trimming decisions. Since these problems have persisted, the committee hired a tree specialist and we have implemented the following:

- 1. Trim the two trees at Marmara Bay down to a level that will permit the experimentation that is planned.
- 2. These are the **only** trees that are going to be trimmed until we know for sure that our plan is going to work. It might take a year or two.
- 3. Six to eight weeks from now, the tree specialist will come back to check the trees for budding. Depending where and how and if the buds form, our specialist will determine if grafts are necessary including where and how many. With grafting, the shape and size of the tree may be determined. With this method, the tree has the chance to double its life expectancy and become very beautiful.
- 4. In the event one or both trees die they will be replaced with box trees of the same variety.
- 5. In the meantime, the committee will make decisions about trimming errant branches that cause view blockage, roof overhang and root problems from the other pine trees.

TRAFFIC & SAFETY COMMITTEE

- Mariner Gate update: The contract has been awarded and work will begin mid-January. The Board is working with the architect and contractor to make sure there are allowances for additional conduit and wiring for possible future needs. The committee is getting information on a bar-code decal system and a transponder system.
- Cabrillo Isle Gate update: A second architect is drawing up plans for the Sentry house, even though the 1999 budget doesn't allow for it. Open meeting/workshops are planned for March to discuss this.
- 3. Pedestrian Gate update: The Committee reviewed rule #6110 (regarding fences) which was adopted by the Board in November.
- 4. As a result of discussions with Lincoln Security regarding their personnel, a fax machine has been installed, the phone system modified and the beach lot patrols have been beefed up. In addition, the sentry and patrol officers are wearing name tags and their names are posted on the Sentry house. Day passes may be changed and patrol hours varied; Lincoln's reports will be weekly, and a patrol tour system and been installed to account for the whereabouts of patrol officers at anytime.
- 5. The committee requested that the Board raise the reward for vandalism fund from \$200 to \$500, if possible.

- 6. The committee would like to explore a new type of day pass. Lincoln will furnish examples from other communities.
- 7. The speed trailer will go to the Villas and then to Shackleton Isle.
- 8. The Board reported that the County is considering the replacement of the chain link fence at the Beach. A new fence panel is being constructed and installed at the beach pedestrian gate by NSCA.

SEASHORES BLOTTER

- 1. In November, there was a burglary on Breakers Isle and the sheriff was called.
- 2. During the month five cars were broken into and articles stolen. In every case, the cars were not locked. If your car is parked outside, please keep it locked!!
- 3. Dirt has been taken repeatedly from the empty lot on Magellan Isle. The owner is just about to start construction of a new home. This is private property and that includes the dirt!! Removing dirt will be considered theft.
- 4. The Sheriff responded on November 10 to a call about a disturbance on Crossjack.

MARINER GATE RENOVATIONS

As Jerry Milner has noted in his "From the Helm" report, Mariner Gate renovations will be starting about January 11. We are working closely with the contractor to minimize disruption, but disruption there will be.

During the estimated 8 to 9 weeks of renovation, Mariner Gate could be completely closed to automobile traffic for as long as three weeks. We are hopeful that the closure could be less but we prefer that you know the worst scenario, depending on the weather, rather than receiving unwanted updates on expanding delays. During the Mariner closure period, the Selva Gate arm will be kept open for access to the Shores. We plan to increase Lincoln Security patrols during this time period.

If on occasion while the Mariner Gate is closed to traffic and it becomes necessary to return the Selva Gate to normal operation, a patrol officer will be on duty to assist the entrance of guests and service personnel.

The Ports O'Call and Cabrillo Isle gates will continue to operate normally. Pedestrian traffic at Mariner Gate will be as usual with the exception that all pedestrians are warned that construction is underway and more than normal caution should be observed.

We truly regret this imposition but hope you will understand that doing the work at this time of year rather than in the warmer more popular months will minimize inconvenience to each of you.




MENS GOLF

WOMENS CLUB


