







The Board has:

- On the relocation of the flag pole; per staff suggestion.
- Welcomed Forrest Owen to the Board. Forrest is a management consultant and was chairman of our Security Committee.

Welcomed, also, Lou Peck, who is the new Security Committee chairman.

- Acknowledged completion of Phase I of the beach slope control project, at an approximate cost of \$56,000, substantially below the anticipated \$63,000 expenditure authorized. At present, the "rip-rap" is 13 feet above mean sea level. The remainder of the project known as Phase II which would raise the existing "rip-rap" 5 feet is being thoroughly studied.
- Noted that certain tree view blockage problems continue to plague the Community. It (the Board) has reaffirmed its determination to uphold the CC&R's and By Laws on this matter.
- Increased the NSCA liability insurance coverage from \$5,000,000 to \$10,000,000, upon recommendation of the Association's agent.
- -- Heard Mr. William Hall, General Manager, give an updated progress report on the neighboring Ritz-Carlton Hotel; Curently scheduled for completion in June 1984. Mr. Hall expressed willingness to cooperate with the Association in any way possible.
- Been informed that reclaimed water pipe installation should be under way by the time this is delivered to residents.



Crime Prevention

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH SUGGESTIONS

Our Neighborhood Watch program in Niguel Shores is intended as a means of discouraging burglaries. It is not a panacea that will completely eliminate them. This past month we had several burglaries. However, by working together and cooperating in the Neighborhood Watch we can significantly reduce the incidences of this type of crime. If you have not yet signed up for the Neighborhood Watch, please contact the NSCA office for information and the name of a contact person.

These are some suggestions from the Orange County Sheriff's Office to discourage burglaries:

- Report any suspicious persons or vehicles to the Sheriff's Department. Write down their descriptions and license numbers.
- 2. Be sure you have deadbolt locks on all exterior doors.
- 3. Be sure your street number is easily read and illuminated at night.
- 4. Prune large trees near your house so that a burglar will not have easy access to a second story window.
- 5. Keep shrubbery trimmed so that it doesn't block the view from any door or window and so that it doesn't provide a hiding place for a burglar.

There will be no Crafts Class in December. Marilee Davis will be looking forward to seeing you "crafty" people again in January.


