FROM THE HELM

During the November open meeting it was called to our attention that the recent assessment letter contained no estimates for the current year against which the figures given for next year could be compared. None of the assessment letters issued since 1980 have included such current information, but this Board agrees that such information will be helpful in understanding the budget. A summary of the budget is shown below including the 1984 figures. More detailed information will be available at the December open meeting. (December 12 at 7:30 pm)

Notes: (1) Decrease due primarily to the fact that increases in utilities were more than offset by decreases in other accounts.

(2) Increase due primarily to increases in drainage and planting.

(3) Increase due primarily to increases in guard services and Selva gate replacement. (4) This represents a reserve for unforseen expenses. As the nature of these expenses becomes known during the year, the actual expense account is charged and (in effect) this account is decreased. The 1984 figure represents the excess of estimated 1984 income over 1984 estimated expenses as of 9/30/84. (5) Increase is due primarily to required increases in the reserve rate for street surfacing and gates. (6) Decrease is due primarily to an expected decrease in bank interest.

The percentage increase or decrease in assessments over each of the last five years is: 8.5% ('80-'81); 10.1% ('81-'82); -6.9% ('82-'83); 7.4% ('83-'84); 8.3% ('84-'85). Total assessment increase for the five year period is 29.3%. Total consumer price index increase for the same period is 30.1% (est).

COPY MACHINE REPLACEMENT

Approved replacement of the Xerox 2400 model copier with a Xerox 1055 model. (1985 Budget Expense)

STORER CABLE TV

Requested Mr. Knight seek through Seashore News survey input from membership on any member "problems" with Storer Cable television reception/service.

MEMBER FINE

Voted to assess a member a fine of \$25.00 for repeated violations of vehicle parking rules.

BEACH SLOPE REPAIR-PHASE II

Directed management to discuss consultant recommendations with engineers as a means to expedite this project so that all information can be assimilated and presented to the membership.

MANAGER'S COLUMN

HOME IMPROVEMENTS/CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS:

Members who undertake modifications to their residences (including exterior color changes) are reminded that prior approval of your Architectural Control Committee is required. In addition, upon approval by the Architectural Control Committee, a "work in progress" on-site inspection card is issued which must be posted on the property prior to starting home improvements in a location which is visible from the street. Construction projects underway without this on-site inspection card posted should be reported to the Administrative Offices (493-0122).

WATER RECLAMATION PROJECT:


Niguel Shores has been notified by the South Coast County Water District that connection of the new landscape watering system is now underway. Meter connection and miscellaneous modifications will require some weeks to accomplish. During the next few weeks "caution" is advised as street and sidewalk cutting to permit the completion for this system is necessary. The disruption should be minor, however, compared to the major work done earlier this year. I will have more details to report in January, 1985 as the system becomes operational. It should be noted that Niguel Shores is already receiveing (potable) water for landscape services at the reclaimed water price according to the terms of the agreement with South Coasty County Water District (SCCWD). The Board of Directors is continuing to work with SCCWD in efforts to further reduce reclaimed water costs.

Once in operation, our landscape watering with reclaimed water will be done <u>automatically</u> at night (petween 10pm and 6am). Any daytime watering will require manual operations and supervision.

Belatedly, Millicent and I wish to thank the Association for the improved stop signs and berms on the shoreside of the bridge which, although somewhat complex, has served the purpose by definitely slowing down the "non-stop" drivers and giving a fighting chance to those approaching Niguel Shores Road from both directions on Ports of Call Road. Definitely a safety plus!

Due note has been taken of the excellent manner in which the Shores gate has been completed. The entrance is certainly an asset to the area.

We also wish to express our deep appreciation for the planned, periodic glass-cleaning and globe replacements on the outdoor garages, entry arches and street lights. We have tried to keep up personally with those in our vicinity but it is certainly a boost in our pride of Niguel Shores to see the Association assume this responsibility throughout the entire neighborhood. We have had approving comments from our visitors regarding the brightness and sparkle from the lamps as well.

Further, we wish to commend the landscaping and maintenance for the renewed, sharp appearance of the common areas and streets, including the watering, mowing, trimming and street cleaning, which apparently suffered somewhat during the installation of the recycled water and telephone cables.

Presume further improvements will include placing shrubs around the recycled water and telephone cable units, as well as slurring the streets. We wish something could be done also to influence people not to litter the streets with cans, bottles, papers as they drive through, plus containing the cogs on the sidewalks, which makes it pretty tricky if one goes for walks after dark. 
VOICE OF THE PEOPLE CONT'D

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Neighborhood Watch is a community approach to crime prevention and particularly to the prevention of burglaries. Recent reports have disclosed that in Southern California communities with Neighborhood Watch programs there has been a forty percent decline in burglaries.

Neighborhood Watch in Niguel Shores is an active, on-going program. Because we are a unique community with restricted access to vehicles, our program is primarily concerned with burglary prevention.

Here are some facts about the crime of burglary:

- (1) Household burglary is one of the easiest crimes to prevent but one of the most difficult to solve.
- (2) Over one half of police time is spent on investigating burglaries.
- (3) Most home burglars are young amateurs looking for easy targets.
- (4) Statistics show that in over one half of household burglaries there was no forced entry involved.
- (5) A majority of household burglaries occur during daylight hours.

Neighborhood Watch works because it is based on the idea of neighbors looking out for neighbors and reporting suspicious persons and activities to the Sheriff's Office. It encourages participants to secure their homes and property. Operation Identification is a part of Neighborhood Watch aimed at having homeowners place their license numbers on personal property for ready identification. We urge all homeowners and residents to cooperate in this second phase of our Neighborhood Watch program.



VIDEO PRODUCTION CLUB




*PREREGISTRATION IS REQUIRED FOR CLASSES
