At a recent meeting of the Board, the issue of changing the name of Niguel Shores Community Association once again became a discussion item. The June poll evidenced a preference to change the name of the to Association "Monarch Community Association". However, since this initial poll the names of "The Shores" or "The Shores at Monarch Beach" have received positive comments and growing support.

In order to change the name of the Association, the Articles of Incorporation and the CC&Rs must both be amended. With the approval of the recent CC&R amendments, a majority approval (480 lots) is required to amend the CC&Rs. However, a three-fourths approval (720 lots) is required to amend the Articles of Incorporation. Obtaining 720 ballots regardless of vote is a formidable task in itself.

Due to the interest expressed in alternative names and due to the complexity of the balloting procedure itself, the Board directed a second poll be conducted presenting the following options:

- * Monarch Shores Community Association
- * The Shores
- * The Shores at Monarch Beach
- * Niguel Shores Community Association
- * ? your suggestion

The poll is attached to this issue. Take the time to express your choice of name. Be sure to print your name and Niguel Shores address on the poll form. This information will be used only to ensure only one form is returned per lot and will not be released. Only property owners may participate.

Return your poll form to the Association office or drop it in the drop-box located on the exit side of the Mariner gate no later than 5:00pm, December 29, 1989.

This is only a <u>poll</u>. A formal vote will be conducted at a future time.

CC&R VOTE

All six CC&R change proposals were They were recorded in the office of the Orange County Recorder on November 7, 1989 and become effective on December 3, 1989. These amendments (1) permit future changes with a majority vote of the homeowners, (2) eliminate obsolete provisions relating developer, (3) eliminate provisions for privies, (4) authorize fines for CC&R and rule violations on private property (as well as common area), (5) make owners responsible for damage by tenants, and (6) clarify Association responsibility security.

The approval of these amendments to the CC&Rs was the result of the support of a great many discerning homeowners. of course, the Ad Hoc CC&R Committee played a key role in the campaign to obtain approval. Committee members were:

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Following procedure, revisions in the Associations Rules and Regulations other governing documents distributed with the Seashore News.

Attached is a copy of part of the Association's Rules and Regulations amended to reflect a change in the Vehicle Rules.

BEACH PARKING LOT POLICY

The Board of Directors has extended the temporary beach parking lot policy to remain in effect until September 30, This extension means vehicles bearing a valid Special Entry Permit or Visitor Day Permit may park in the upper level of the beach parking lot except on holidays and holiday weekends: November 23-26, December 23-25, December 30-January 1, February 17-19, April 13-15, May 26-28, July 4 and September 1-3.

Additionally the Board approved use of the Guest Parking Permit alone, without being accompanied by either a Visitor Day Permit or Special Entry Permit. Vehicles with a Guest Parking Permit may park on any level of the beach lot.

As usual vehicles with valid owner or tenant decals may park on any level of the beach parking lot on any day.



6603 Guest Parking Permit (11-15-89)

Guest Parking Permits are issued at the discretion of NSCA to persons/vehicles not eligible to receive a vehicle registration package under Rule 6512 or 6516. Such persons/vehicles may park in otherwise restricted parking areas only if in possession of a Guest Parking Permit. Issuance of a Guest Parking Permit is subject to the payment of a deposit and such other terms and conditions as the Association may deem appropriate.

6604 "No Call" List (12-16-86)

- A. <u>Resident Property Owners and Tenants</u> may authorize admittance of regular visitors without prior call to the guard at the main gate by submitting written authorization to the Association office on the "Visitor No Call List".
- B. A maximum of four such authorizations shall be permitted for each property address at any one time.
- C. Revisions to the Visitor No Call List shall <u>cancel</u> all previous authorizations.
- D. Authorizations must be signed by the OWNER OF RECORD OR TENANT.
- E. Visitors on the Visitor No Call List will be issued a Visitor Day Permit by the guard which shall be displayed in the vehicle while in the community.
- F. RESIDENTS SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED ENTRY BY "NO CALL" AUTHORIZATION. Admittance of owners and tenants shall be in conformance with these rules.
- G. A visitor's "No Call" status may be denied or revoked, at the discretion of management, for the visitor's failure to comply with the CC&Rs and/or the Association's Rules, including, without limitation, these Vehicle Rules.

6605 Realtor Entry (12-16-86)

When property in Niguel Shores is for sale or rent, real estate agents and prospective purchasers or tenants will be granted entry only as follows:

A. Owner Call-In

- 1. <u>Mariner Entrance</u>: The property owner may call the Mariner gate to authorize entry for a specific agent/client on the day the property is to be shown.
- 2. <u>Manta or Garibaldi Entrances</u>: Owners in The Villas and Sea Terrace II must receive the agent's call on arrival at the gate and execute entry procedures.
- B. Letter of Authorization. Property owners may authorize admittance in the owner's absence until the property is sold or rented by submitting a Letter of Authorization to the Association office. The letter shall include the owner's name, address of the property listed, and shall designate the specific real estate agent or firm to be admitted. If the property is on a multiple listing and the owner wishes all real estate agents to be admitted upon proper identification, the letter must so state.
 - 1. <u>Mariner Entrance</u>: Each entry must be cleared through the Association office. Office personnel will verify authorization from the letter on file and will notify the security officer to permit entry.
 - 2. <u>Manta or Garibaldi Entrance</u>: After entrance authorization has been verified, agents may borrow a key card from the Association office. The agent's Department of Real Estate identification card will be retained in the Association office until return of the key card.
- C. <u>Identification</u>. Each agent will be required to show the guard at the gate his/her Department of Real Estate identification card, and to present a real estate business card upon which has been written the date of the visit and the address of the property to be shown. Only that property for which authorization has been granted shall be shown.
- D. <u>Caravans</u>. Caravans are permitted within Niguel Shores on Thursday mornings only between the hours of 9:00am and 1:00pm, or at such other times as the Board of Directors may designate. Drivers of caravan vehicles must present identification as required above.

6606 Public Officer Entry (12-16-86)

Any public officer involved in discharging, or attempting to discharge, any duty of his office shall, upon providing proper identification, be admitted to Niguel Shores.
