BOARD ACTIONS



- The Board conferred with legal counsel on legal and litigation issues and conducted several violation hearings and imposed fines.
- The Board adopted new rules in compliance with amendments to the Davis-Stirling Act that, as of 1/1/2005, require an Internal Dispute Resolution Policy (IDR) (Civil Code Section 1363.850) and an amendment to existing Alternative Dispute Resolution Policy (ADR) (Civil Code Section 1369.590) The addition of an IDR Policy and amendment to ADR Policy will be included, as approved, to the NSCA Rules and Regulations and are not subject to the 30-day review of the membership as they were written in compliance with the Civil Code sections identified above.
- The Board postponed reviewing additional NSCA *Rules and Regulations* until the Jan. 5, 2005 Board meeting.
- The Board reviewed and approved the 2005 Budget and Reserve Analysis study at their November 3 meeting.
- In the interest of safety and liability to the Association, the Board approved expending \$600 to have holiday lighting installed and removed by an out-

MESSAGE FROM GENERAL MANAGER

The NSCA Office and Maintenance Staff and I join together in wishing you all a very happy holiday season and a Happy New Year. The office will be closed on December 24, 25 and 31. A weekend clerk will be available, as usual, on January 1.

In the event of an emergency, on the days the office is closed and after hours, the quickest way to get your information to the proper staff member is to call the guardhouse and advise the guard of the nature of the emergency.

Trash Collection in December and January - In checking with the CR&R trash collection company, I have been advised there will be no delayed collections days in December or January.

Christmas trees will be picked up on your normal collection day through January 9. Remove all ornaments, lights and stand. Cut the tree in half if it is over eight feet tall. Place the tree curbside next to the regulation containers. Flocked trees will also be collected.

As a courtesy to your neighbors, please refrain from putting your trash out prior to the evening before your scheduled collection day and bring in your empty containers as soon as possible on the day of collection. Be sure that your trash is securely contained within your trash containers so that wrapping materials and other trash and debris doesn't become dislodged and dispersed throughout your neighborhood. And, if at all possible, it would be greatly appreciated by your neighbors if construction bins

were to be removed prior to the two holiday weekends and a fresh container delivered after the holiday season is over.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

The Architectural Control Committee would like to remind residents who apply for an exterior modification permit to be very exact in following the checklist which accompanies the request form. If the checklist is not complete, the committee has no choice but to continue or deny the homeowner request, based on the need for pertinent information. So please help yourself and the ACC to speed along the approval process by following the steps on the checklist.

TRAFFIC AND SAFETY

Many of us this time of year use our fireplaces. Be sure that the chimney is in good order and that you have a spark arrestor. If not, you could suffer roof damage due to falling embers.

If you put up holiday lights, be sure that the wiring is in good condition. A frayed or broken wire could result in a fire. Also, do not leave the lights on while the house is not occupied.

HOLIDAY PARTIES

If you are planning a holiday party be sure to provide your guest list at least 2 business days prior to the event so that your guests will not be delayed at the gate. If you are expecting between 4 and 9 guest vehicles you can FAX the list, with your Personal Identification Code, to the gate at 487-4182 or deliver it in person. If you are going to have a party with ten or more guest vehicles, you MUST submit an alphabetized list, with your PIC, to the office 48 hours prior to the event. DO NOT give this list directly to the gate officer. The office staff will prepare the passes in advance so that they will be ready when your guests arrive. Failure to do so will cause your guests unnecessary inconvenience.
