BOARD ACTIONS



- The Board conferred with legal counsel on legal and litigation issues and conducted several violation hearings and imposed fines.
- The Board approved a proposal from West Coast Paving to repair the slope erosion below 8 Breakers Isle that was caused by a broken Association irrigation line.
- Discussion of proposals to install a spike strip at the Selva entry gate was deferred as the Board is requesting clarification relative to the scope of the project.
- The Board allocated \$5,000 from contingency funds to commence updating the Association's reclaimed water components and signage to bring the components into compliance as directed by South Coast Water District. Additional funding will be allocated in the coming years until all of the components are in compliance.
- The Board accepted, with regret, the resignation of Bob and Lavonne Borland and Karla Sanders from the Recreation Committee.
- The Board accepted, with regret, the resignation of Roy Dohner as Chairman of the *ad hoc* Community Center Renovation Project Committee.

It is apparent that it will be more cost effective to modernize on a limited plan. The Board of Directors is working to find a project that will be acceptable to the members of the Association. I hope that the opponents of repair and replacement will reconsider their stance and support the vast majority of the community that are willing to work together on an acceptable plan.

The Board and ad hoc committee have a vision for Niguel Shores, but it is obvious that this vision does not coincide with the views of a vast majority of homeowners.


