## NEW SECURITY SYSTEM

New vehicle decals and card keys will be issued to all residents of Niguel Shores community during the month of January. Registration will begin on Saturday, January 5, 1974, at the Niguel Shores Community Center office from 10:00AM to 2:00PM, and this same schedule will apply on Sunday, January 6, 1974, and on the following Saturday and Sunday. On weekdays (Monday through Friday) residents may obtain their new decals and card keys at the Community Center office from 9:00AM to 6:00PM. To secure your new passes you must bring your vehicle along with driver's license and registration certificate (lease papers for leased vehicles). The decal will be affixed to your vehicle at the time of issuance. A maximum of three (3) vehicles will be registered from each household without special consent from the Board of Directors. Renters are required to bring proof of renting (lease papers, rent receipts, etc.) to verify with computer tape.

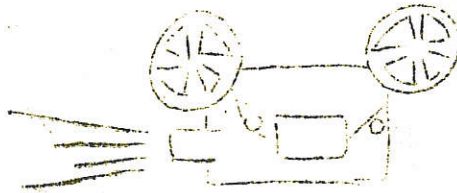
The old decals will NOT be honored for admittance after January 31, 1974. The Selva Road and Stonehill Drive gates will open with the new card keys. The Mariner and Shore gates will remain active for the old card keys through January 31, 1974. Old decals and card keys should be destroyed after January 31, 1974.

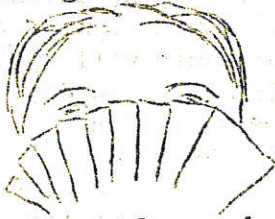
### FREE MOVIES

ARF! ARF! - SOMETHING FOR THE DOGS!

Professional animal trainer, Bill Lindsey, brings "Comfort Training" to our community's animal population. Three different classes will be held, as noted below, at the Shores beach parking lot where masters will be trained to teach their own dogs obedience.

January 24, 1974	- Thursday	2:00PM-3:00PM

A six foot leather leash and a metal choke chain are standard equipment prerequisites for attending the class. Ten lessons are provided - one one-hour lesson per week - for \$25.00 per dog. A dog owner may expect to train his dog to be more enjoyable for the community, to help the dog learn what pleases its owner, and to train the dog to walk by the owner's side, sit or heel. PROTECT YOURSELVES! THIS IS UNSAFE

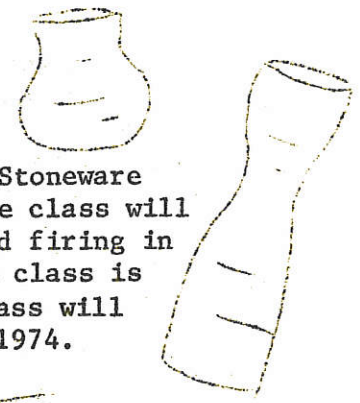

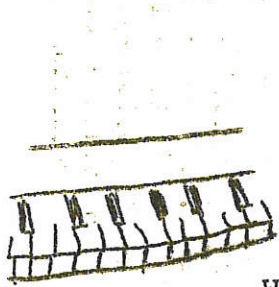
BIG SPLASH DAY

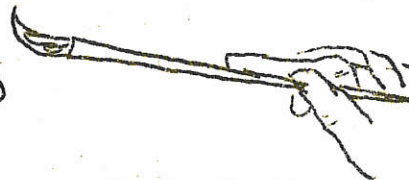


LET'S HEAR THAT SOUND!
