Observed that the Windlass drainage project has improved the condition of the bank.

NEW SECURITY ENTRANCE SYSTEM

PROPERTY OWNER DECALS

New property owner auto decals have been ordered and will be issued in February. Information regarding issuance dates and requirement will be forwarded to all owners during January.

PASSES

Effective February 1, 1982, all current passes will expire, and the new security entrance system will be in effect. All current passes must be renewed by that date. Please review the following information carefully.

TENANT PASS-DECALS

Current passes and decals have been replaced by the Tenant Security package, which consists of one auto pass-decal and one key card, issued for a one-time fee of \$50, \$25 of which is refundable upon return of the security items. Credit will be given for proof of previously paid fees, and the pass-decal may be renewed at no additional charge upon presentation of a copy of the renewed lease or rental agreement. To be issued a new pass-decal, you must provide a copy of your vehicle registration form, satisfy the \$50 fee or provide proof of previous payment (by receipt or cancelled check) and have on file in the office a current tenant declaration form and copy of your current lease or rental agreement. packages will be available at the Association office beginning January 25, during normal office hours of 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, Staff members will also be available to issue security items on Saturday, January 30, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

GUEST PASS-DECALS

Quarterly passes will no longer be issued, and have been replaced by the 30 day Guest Pass-Decal and/or Visitor "No Call" list. Guest pass-decals are designed for short-term visitors only, and will be issued only upon written authorization of the property owner or registered tenant, presentation of the vehicle registration form and proper identification (i.e. valid driver's license). Guest pass-decals will not be issued to tenants, such as for short term or summer rentals. All tenants must secure the standard Tenant Pass-Decal.

DAY PASSES

Passes for one to three days may be issued to visitors upon previous call to the security gate by the property owner or registered tenant.




SERVICE PASSES

Passes will be issued to service personnel, such as gardners, pool maintenance personnel, etc., upon written authorization of the property owner or registered tenant, and upon presentation of the vehicle registration form and proper identification.

VISITOR "NO CALL" LIST

The new "No Call" list is designed specifically for friends and relatives who are frequent visitors to a resident's home. Adult resident property owners and registered tenants may authorize admittance of regular visitors without prior call to the security gate by submitting written authorization to the Association office on the Visitor "No Call" form. Authorizations will be accepted beginning January 18, during regular office hours of 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. A maximum of four such authorizations will be permitted per property address at any one time. Tenants may not be included on the "No Call" list.

Please Note: The security guards may not accept "No Call" authorizations, additions or deletions. All authorizations must be made at the Association office. Any revisions to the list will automatically cancel the entire list, and new authorizations must be filed with the office on the appropriate form.

RECYCLING

PROGRAM

A comparison of paper recycling for 10 months (through October) of 1981 vs 1980 shows a reduction of 33 tons. Considering that April and May had no pick-up, and until June, there was no paper shed, the loss was not too serious. However, there is little doubt that paper contribution is lower now than when it was picked up at curbside. All we can do is ask that our supporters save and recycle all newspapers, magazines, and particularly those merry Christmas brochures received during the holdiays and deliver them anytime between 9:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. to our storage shed, 7 days a week.

Aluminium requirements have changed again. Now they tell us they do not want any aluminium except BEVERAGE cans. Apparently when fed into the furnaces, the light weight aluminium becomes ash, and does not melt as the cans do.

Presently we are handling about 100 pounds of aluminium per month at 28c per pound.

Two new outdoor showers at poolside have been financed by your paper recycling effort, and within the coming month the roofing over our Community Center walkway should be completed. All this cost our fund about \$2,000.

Keep up the good work - REMEMBER, STASH THEM, DON'T TRASH THEM.

Remember the Womens Club is open to all women residents and is a great way to promote friendship and enlarge your social contacts. Dues are \$2.00 a year.




