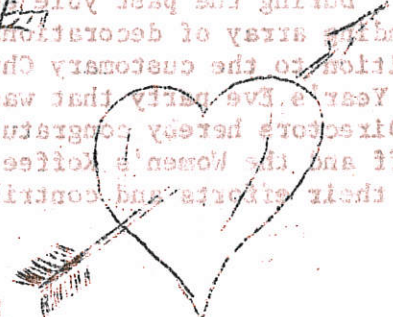
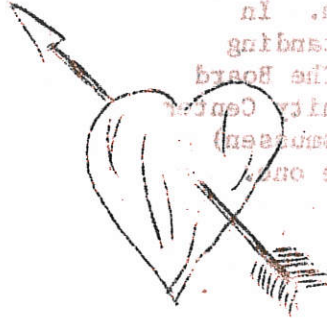
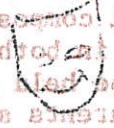

With the unannounced squeeze resulting from the rise in the cost of living, gourmet cooking could be an expensive no-no. ## ZONING COMMITTEE REPORT

Approximately 70 residents have attended each of our last few meetings, and we hope our attendance on January 29th (held after this writing) set an all-time high.

The meetings are intended primarily to communicate to our community the plans for the surrounding undeveloped tracts and to determine just what are the concerns of the residents. Because of the passage of Proposition 20, the Coastal Protection initiative, over a year ago, and the fact that we live within the area where a permit from the Coastal Commission must be obtained to build anything, our concerns are of great interest to the Commission. Members of our committee have attended permit hearings, and the Commission has been especially responsive to letters, wires and phone calls from the many residents who have expressed their opinions.

At our meeting on January 29th, Avco Community Developers showed new plans for the Coastal tracts which they hope will meet with approval of the Coastal Commission and the community. Densities have been reduced, commercial projects have been shifted, most of them off the Coast Highway, gas stations have been removed, and open and green space has been increased. If you did not attend and wish to know the specifics of these plans, our recreation center office can refer you to a member of our committee. Names and addresses of Coastal Commission members are also available from committee members should you wish to express your opinions to the Commission staff. All of ACD's changes will require new permit hearings.

Future goals of the Zoning Committee include: (1) more involvement with Laguna Niguel Homeowners Association on matters that concern the entire area of Laguna Niguel; (2) representation on the various committees of USOCC (United South Orange Coast Communities), an organization of all surrounding coastal communities which has given us a larger voice in our county government; and (3) greater attendance at meetings so that they can be a forum to express other community concerns, such as schools and roads. Our representatives can then reflect your feelings.

We meet on the last Tuesday evening, 7:30PM, of each month. Next meeting is February 26th.

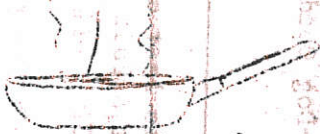
### LADIES DAY - SOCIAL TENNIS
