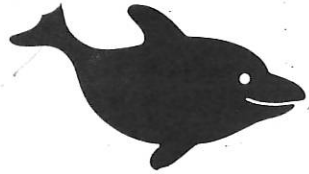

GREENBELT VANDALISM - \$1000 REWARD

Many of you are aware that several of our greenbelts are being driven on late at night. The greenbelt at the east end of Atlantic Drive, next to the Selva Gate, has been damaged the most. It is believed that the individual(s) is either a resident and/or a visitor of a resident in our community.

This issue is not about the cost of repairs to the turf, which is minimal, but the fact that these acts of vandalism are wanton and deliberate.

The Board of Directors wants to prosecute the individual(s) and will pay \$1000 to anyone who has information that will lead to the identity and apprehension. Anyone that comes forward may have to supply a sworn statement and, if necessary, testify in a court.

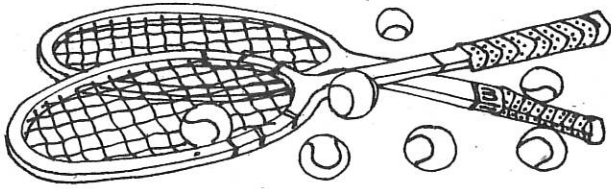

THE MAYOR OF DANA POINT WILL BE AT THE FEBRUARY OPEN MEETING TO DISCUSS CITY ISSUES. THERE WILL BE A SHORT QUESTION AND ANSWER PERIOD.

JANUARY BOARD ACTIONS

1. Accepted contract with Westridge Security Service for 1993. Cost will be \$13,500 per month.
2. Accepted contract with R.F. Dickson Company for street sweeping in 1993. Cost will be \$520 per month.
3. Denied homeowner request for reimbursement of tire replacements for punctures suffered at Selva Gate.
4. Approved use of MPR on January 31 for Super Bowl Party sponsored by the Mens Club.
5. Authorized management to purchase a second fire-rated file cabinet for accounting records. Cost will be \$700.
6. Authorized management to purchase a computer system for Mariner gate. Cost will be \$1469.
7. Authorized management to proceed with removal of yield sign at Mariner and Niguel Shores Drive and replace with stop sign. Work to occur in February.
8. Authorized M&K Masonry to remove remaining concrete at community center entry and replace with brick over sand base at a cost of \$3600.
9. Authorized management to expend up to \$3500 to install copper wiring to common area lighting on Nauticus Isle.

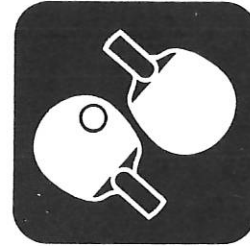

CHANGE IN STREET SWEEPING

During 1993, the Board has authorized a change that will save money and increase the cleanliness of our streets. The new program is as follows:



1. All streets will be machine swept once per month on the second Friday of each month.

2. Prior to R.F. Dickson Company doing their sweeping, Wendt Landscaping will be cleaning the parking areas and street ends in the Garden Homes, Shores Garden Homes and the Villas. These areas were previously hand swept by Dickson on a quarterly schedule.

3. Our maintenance staff will be flushing with water several areas every other month. Several curb and gutter areas on streets such as Breakers Isle, Nauticus Isle, Mercator Isle and portions of Niguel Shores Drive can only be adequately cleaned with water flushing. This work will also be completed prior to Dickson using their machine.

The scheduled date for street sweeping this month is Friday, February 12. This date is also indicated on the attached calendar. If at all possible, you are requested to have your vehicles off the street on this date to allow the street sweeper to do a thorough job.

PING PONG TABLE USE - PROCEDURE CHANGE

The Recreation Committee has recommended to the Board of Directors the following:

1. Residents wishing to use the table may do so, but must supply their own paddles and ball.

2. A ping pong ball may be purchased from the office for \$.25 each.

3. The existing, worn paddles will not be replaced, however, they will continue to be lent out in their existing poor condition.

The Board has accepted this recommendation and it will be implemented February 1.

The problem is not the cost, but carelessness by both adults and children. In a three week period last summer, residents lost or broke several dozen ping pong balls. New paddles were also purchased during the summer and two were broken in half by fall. The others have been chipped and split from misuse.

The association will continue to supply the table and net. In fact, a new fiberglass table was purchased in January.

Both the Recreation Committee and Board are sorry if some residents feel penalized, but they feel this is the proper response to this continuing problem.



TRASH PICK-UP CHANGES

There have been many inquiries on various issues regarding trash pick-up in Niguel Shores. The following information should be helpful to you. It has been supplied by representatives of Solag:

* If you live in the main section of the community, your trash pick-up day has been changed from Tuesday to Thursday. This change should already have been implemented by the time this newsletter is published. Those affected by this change should have received a notice directly from Solag. Neither Solag or the City consulted with the Board of Directors or management on this change.

* If you live in the Villas or Sea Terrace II (Tracts 9098 and 8602), your trash pick-up day will remain Tuesday.

* Your new bins should already have been delivered. If you have not received yours, contact Solag at 240-0446.

* If you wish to change the size of bins you have been issued, wait thirty days after delivery of the bins and call Solag at 240-0446. An information packet will accompany the bins.

* If you do not wish to use the service of Solag and will dispose of your trash in another manner, forms can be obtained in the NSCA office. However, it is our understanding that a minimum monthly charge will still apply. The resident is responsible to return the form to Solag.

* If you are going to be away from your home for an extended period of time (over a month), you can file for temporary exemption. These forms can be obtained in the NSCA office and as above, must be returned to Solag directly.

* The billing for Solag's services will be sent directly to the property owner. If a tenant resides on the property, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to decide who will pay the bill. Contact Solag directly, not the NSCA office, for address billing changes.

If you have any problems, questions or comments regarding this service, please contact Solag directly at 240-0446. The NSCA office staff will not be able to answer any more questions than have been answered in the above article.

REMINDER

Residents are advised that Rules 9203 and 9204 must be followed. Containers cannot be left out so as to be visible from the street. Also, containers cannot be put out more than 12 hours in advance of pick-up and must be put away within 12 hours of pick-up. Leaving containers out is also a violation of City regulations.

MARINER GATE - INSTALLATION OF STOP SIGN

There has been much discussion by the Board of Directors and several committees about the intersection of Niguel Shores Drive and Mariner. For many years, this 3-way intersection has been controlled by two stop signs and a yield sign.

The Board of Directors has decided to remove the yield sign and replace it with another stop sign. Weather permitting, the change will occur February 19. When approaching the gate on this date, you will be directed by gate personnel to enter on the exit side while paint dries on the entry side. Mariner will only be used as an entry gate and all outgoing traffic will have to use the Selva gate for the several hours this change is being implemented.

Your cooperation while this work is being done will be greatly appreciated.

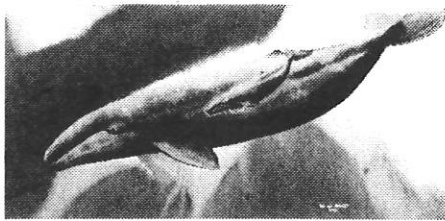
