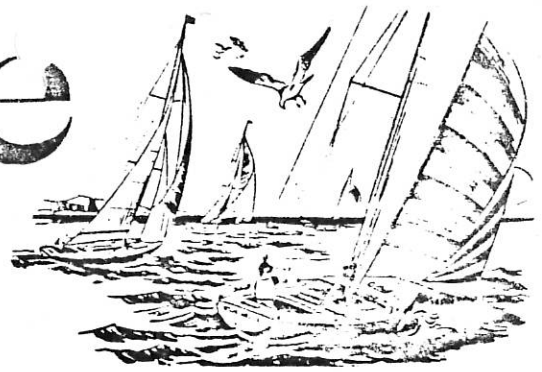

NIGUEL SHORES NEWSPAPER RECYCLING PROGRAM A SUCCESS ! ! !

The newspaper recycling program sponsored by the Niguel Shores Men's Club has been showing increased participation each week.

The first week we recycled 3,120 pounds; the second week, 4,020 pounds, and the third week, 5,420 pounds.

Our community can be very proud of its efforts so far. These programs move slowly at first because it takes time to reach all the residents through the limited media of the monthly Sea Shores News bulletin, and it is easy to forget that "Monday is Paper Day".

Hopefully, more and more residents will join this worthwhile movement to save our natural resources, by saving papers instead of tossing them into the trash container. Remember - South Laguna Disposal Company (SOLAG) does NOT recycle anything. Everything that they pick up on trash day is taken to a dump area and covered with earth - gone for good.

The recycled papers are delivered to a paper mill where they are converted back into fresh paper for more newspapers, thus saving countless trees from destruction, or at least prolonging their life.

Why not keep a carton or box in your garage and stash your discarded newspapers, telephone books, and similar paper products there until Monday, and then place them at your curbside for pickup by the big blue D & J Recycling Company (International) truck. Your box or carton will not be taken away.

Starting Monday, March 6, the truck will arrive earlier so that the pickup can be completed during daylight hours. This will require that our papers be at the curb by 2 P.M. instead of 4 P.M. as in the past.

To those residents not yet involved - - Won't you please join us in the support of this excellent project?

We will soon have funds to initiate our first community improvement which will probably be some new kitchen equipment for our Recreation Area Clubhouse.
