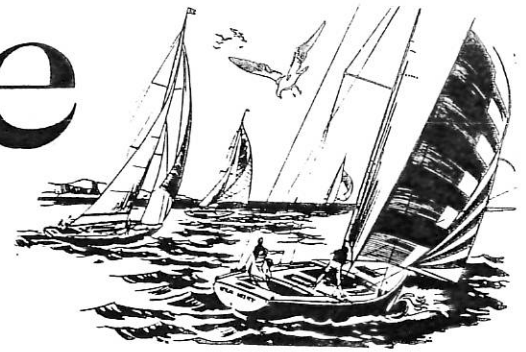

## FROM THE HELM

### PERSONAL REPORT TO NIGUEL SHORES

Since August of last year many of us who live in Niguel Shores have acquired an understanding of the advantages and disadvantages of the proposed Laguna Niguel Community Service District. During action initiated by John Bulleit followed by a Board directed Ad Hoc Committee headed by Ken Knight, your Board of Directors studiously avoided taking sides on the issue until a careful financial analysis of alternatives had been completed. It was evident, meanwhile, that the Orange County Board of Supervisors and the Laguna Niguel Community Council intended to push this project through regardless of studies or the opinions of many interested residents. The LNCC appeals process unfortunately was flawed, derailed, and subverted over strenuous objections of our several representatives.

We broached the subject to many other homeowner associations in the southern portion of Laguna Niguel. All such action, led by John Bulleit, was voluntary. Meanwhile, several of us met repeatedly with Richard Turner, Executive Director of the Local Agency Formation Council, who was charged with finding out first hand what the people in Laguna Niguel thought about the proposed CSD.

Finally, as you know, we initiated a letter to LAFCO which petitioned that organization to either (a) defer all action for six months or, (b) exclude the southern one-third of Laguna Niguel for another fiscal year.

This letter/petition in one week was signed by more than 1500 adults living in Monarch Summit, Pacific Island Village, Villa Pacifica, Cape Cove, Niguel Beach Terrace, and Niguel Shores. In addition, the Board of Directors of East Nine, West Nine, and El Niguel Heights wrote letters supporting our petition. More than 2500 homes were represented in writing.

Then after careful review of all the facts the LAFCO Executive Director recommended in writing to his Board that the proposed CSD be denied.

Yet on the day preceding the official LAFCO hearing Supervisor Tom Riley wrote a letter, as requested by certain members of the Laguna Niguel Community Council, recommending that the LAFCO staff recommendation be ignored and that instead LAFCO vote in favor of the CSD proposal. Mr. Riley then came to the LAFCO hearing and sat in the front row while the Chairman and fellow Board of Supervisor Stanton gave John Bulleit exactly five minutes to summarize our case. The resulting vote was 5-0 against all of us in southern Laguna Niguel.

Later a community wide group of our leaders met to assess the damage and decided to set up an ad hoc committee to recommend further action, if any.

However, in my personal opinion, the Niguel Shores Community Association should now accept the loss as a fait accompli and concentrate on electing Directors to the proposed Laguna Niguel CSD Board who will fairly represent all our southern communities, who will understand our need to be involved at last in plans for the new Sea Terrace Park, and who will represent all of our interests intelligently in the future.

To that end an informal community wide committee initiated by Frank Taylor has been formed to suggest such candidates and to offer support and encouragement to them.

We expect responsible and interested southern Laguna Niguel residents to run. Many of us hope that such candidates from Niguel Shores will now step forward. They will get our personal support.

The filing date is March 6. The election is in June.

# Update

## **SHORES APPEAL ON COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT**

Our appeal to reduce the extraordinary size and impact of the proposed Stein-Brief Commercial Center was carried forward by the Board of Supervisors to Wednesday, March 12 at 9:30am at the Hall of Administration in Santa Ana.

This good news was preceded by a Laguna Niguel Community Council 9-5 vote in favor and support of our appeal. In addition Niguel Shores has now been joined by 17 other homeowner association Boards who have formally voted to support us in writing.

More than 4500 homes are now represented in support of our appeal.

This coalition of homeowner associations is now forming an area wide citizens group called "Friends of the Community". The "Friends" steering committee has hired a professional consultant, opened a bank account with private funds, and is leading an organized effort to substantially reduce the size and impact of the Stein-Brief Commercial Center project.

Your Board of Directors authorized an original expenditure of exactly \$100 to participate in payment of the County required filing fee for the Appeal. The balance of the Appeal fees was paid by contributions of the other supportive neighboring communities. Stein-Brief letters and telephone survey calls to our residents, of course, are not authorized by your Board of Directors. In fact, these actions by the developer have served to confirm the virtually universal support your Board continues to receive from our residents during this appeal process.

"The best laid plans of mice and men are wont to go astray."

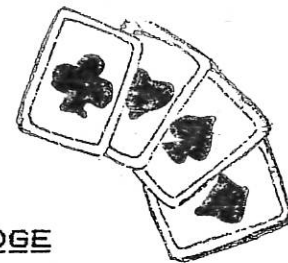

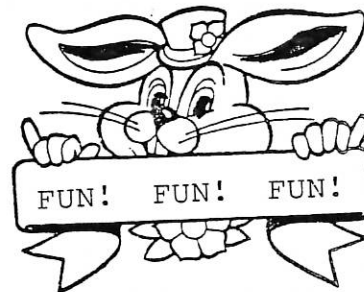
### SUMMER CAMP
