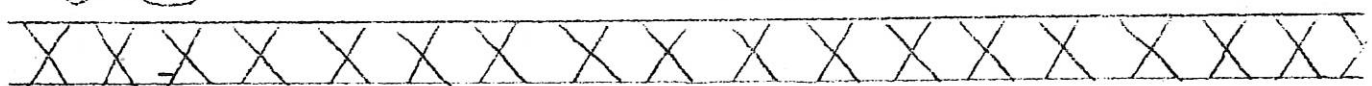


# SEA APRIL NEWS SHORE



### FROM THE HELM

This month I would like to share with you a letter I have received from Supervisor Riley regarding County Reorganization Number 31.

"My office has recently received numerous phone calls and letters from people concerned with the ramifications of County Reorganization No. 31. I support the reorganization as an effort to streamline local government and eliminate a special taxing district.

County Reorganization No. 31 is a complex proposal which, if approved (the issue has been organized so that final approval rests with the voters), will result in the dissolution of the South Laguna Sanitary District (SLSD), which currently provides sewer service to most of the residents in the vicinity of South Laguna. The services presently provided by the SLSD will be taken over by the South Coast County Water District (SCCWD). Within the SCCWD, Improvement District No. 1 (Sewer) will be formed with boundaries identical to those of the current SLSD, in order to charge property owners for the sewer service which will be provided by the SCCWD if the reorganization is approved. The end result of the reorganization will be the elimination of an unnecessary special taxing district and a streamlining of local government. The reasons these two particular districts are combining are that they serve essentially the same territory with related services and that they share the same personnel, office space, and auxiliary equipment.

My staff has thoroughly investigated the growth inducing impacts some fear are associated with County Reorganization No. 31. Please be assured that the reorganization will in no way increase pressures for development in South Laguna.

It is my hope that the information presented in this letter will help clear up any misunderstandings that may surround County Reorganization No. 31. We would like to remind those residents in the Berkus homes, tract 7447, that all slope maintenance and tree trimming is the responsibility of the individual home owners, except those backing up to Niguel Shores road, Mariner Drive and Stonehill Road. You are required to maintain your slope in good condition. This means removal of weeds, dead growth, and debris. Tree trimming is also a very important part of your responsibility in preserving the view of your neighbors. Failure to maintain your slope is a violation of the CC&R'S. Remember also that you must have the written permission of the Architectural Review Committee when planting or replanting your yard or slope areas.

The Board of Directors and the Landscape Committee are now in the process of reviewing the tree trimming report submitted by the professional landscape consultant. Tree trimming will begin this month at last.
