At the present time, our budget will not support traffic cops to patrol within our community. If you, a majority of the residents, want to increase your monthly payments to our Association to cover the expense of our own police department, I expect that our Board of Directors will listen to your pleas.

Another alternative to deter speeders would be the installation of a series of road bumps in your neighborhood, but the Committee feels that this is notdesirable.

- ...wish to change party affiliation

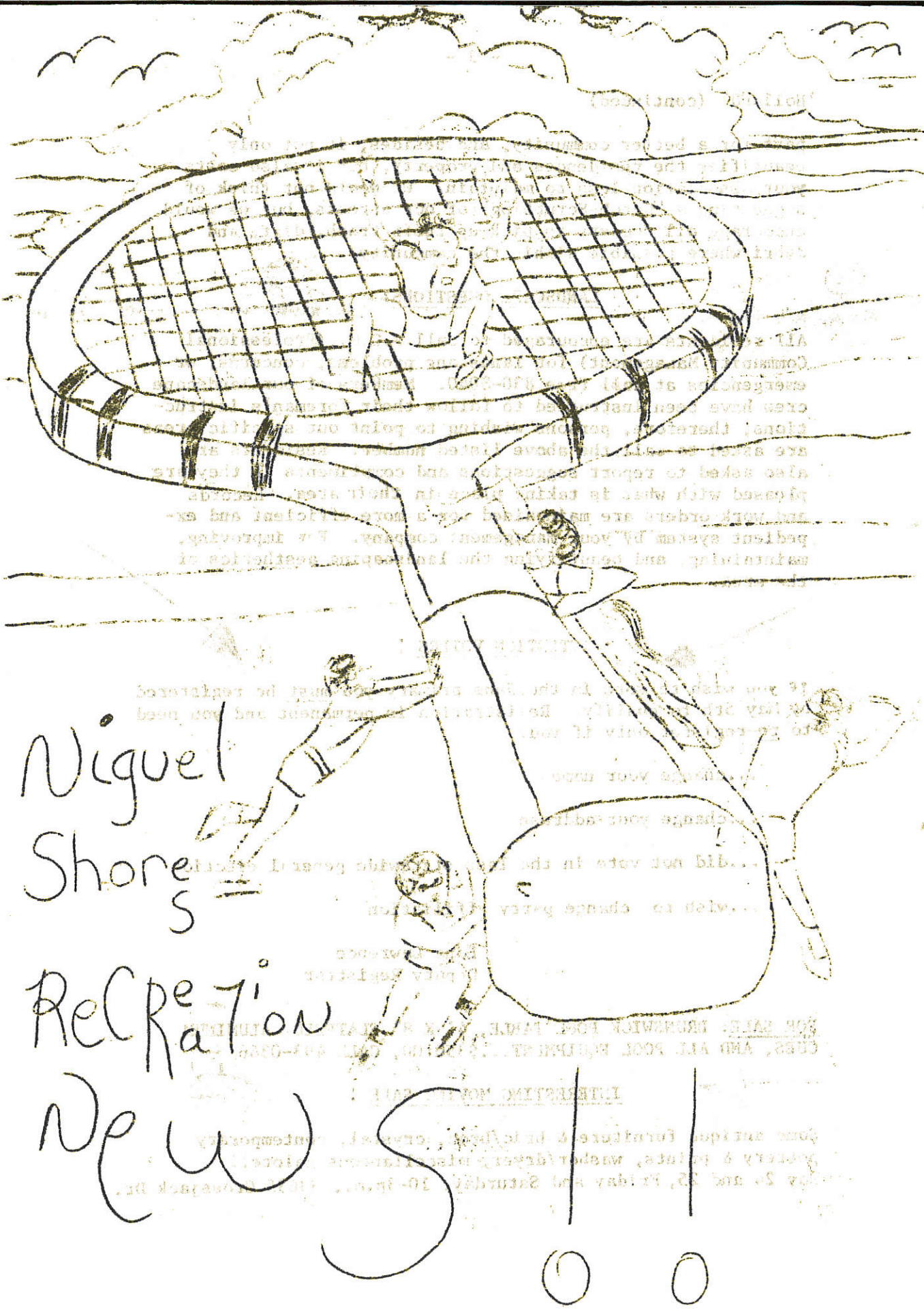

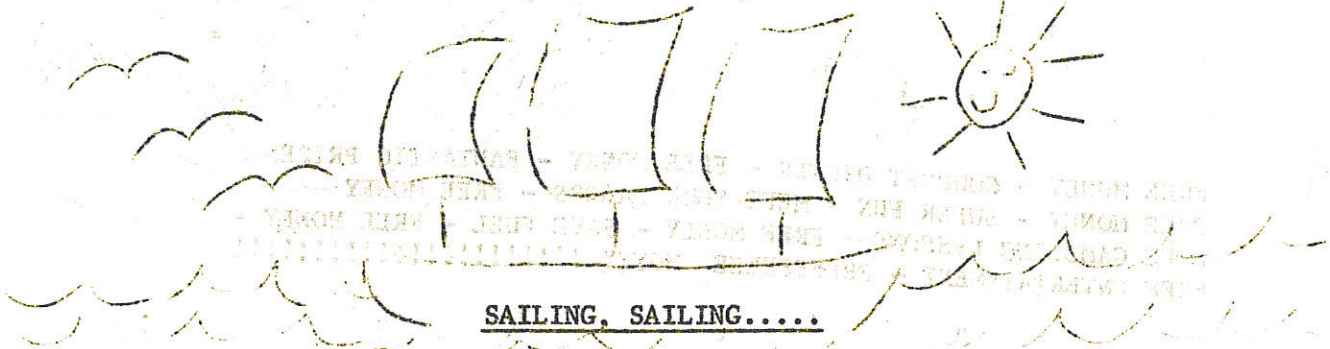
CARTOONING CLASS

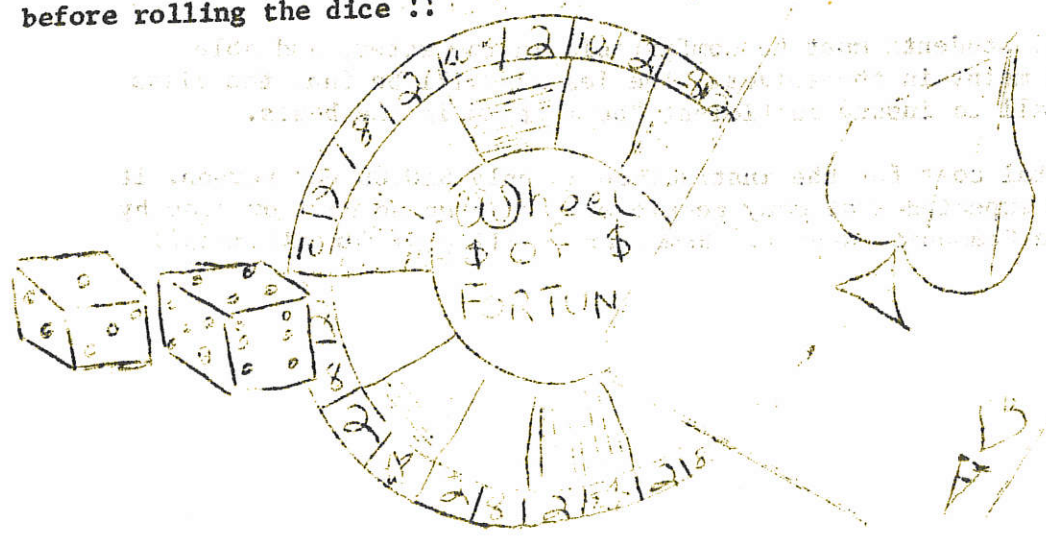
! LAS VEGAS COMES TO LAGUNA NIGUEL !

the shimmering pool, high above the crashing surf!


There will be games for every weakness - craps, black jack,

TENNIS VOCABULARY
