ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTION

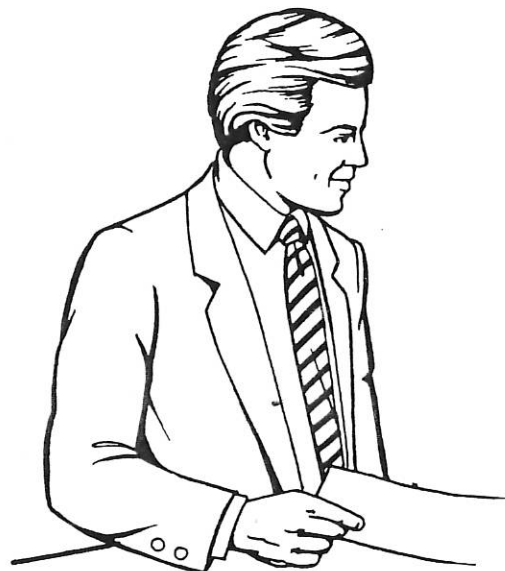
TUESDAY, MAY 21, 1991

OUTRAGEOUS BEHAVIOR

The following letter from a Niguel Shores homeowner to the Board is being published in its entirety (owner's permission) to alert residents to an increasingly serious problem. The Association's rules are established for every resident's benefit and it is expected they be respected, adult or child.

Sunday, March 24, 1991, departing the Rec Center parking lot at 5:00 pm, I was parked in the 3rd slot facing the street, and as I backed up, a black car came screaming in the "Exit Only" driveway and he almost ran into me. The car veered and sped off to park facing the tennis courts. I drove around the circle, parked my car behind and to the right of the black car. Another car had come screaming in the "Enter Only" driveway and parked next to the black car. Eight or more teenagers got out of both cars. I said to the driver of the black car, "Can't you read the sign Exit Only?"

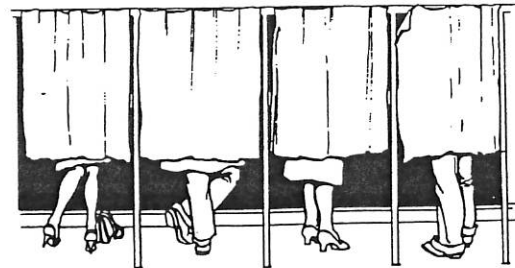
They all started screaming and one stood in the middle of the driveway blocking my car, and one said "----- you, lady!", etc, etc.

I got back into my car and drove up to the teenager until he moved out of the way. I parked facing the street again and went to the office window to report what had happened. Within seconds all of the teenagers were all around me shouting, "She tried to run over my friend's foot! She needs to learn how to drive! She is crazy!" etc, etc." I told the man on duty my side of the story the best I could with eight teenagers screaming. I asked him to take care of the situation and I walked off to the jeers of the "out of control teenagers."

I felt as though I were departing a recreational facility somewhere in east L.A., Watts, downtown Carson, Santa Ana, or any other area a person would or should not go alone.

The plants were concealed on a slope within large shrubs. The Sheriff's Department was called and the plants removed. Because of the location, this farm was obviously being grown by individual(s) who live in the Shores.

Movie night for May is scheduled for Friday, May 10 at 6:30 pm. The hosts are John and Betty Dickerhoff.

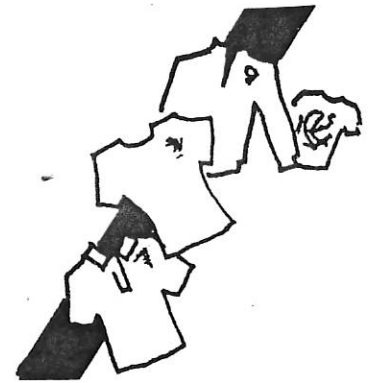
