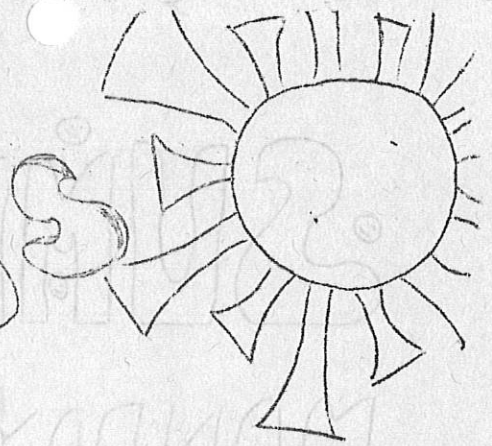

Our objection, put bluntly, is that we want to pay the same rate as other homeowners in the South Coast Water District for the same amount of water. I hope the District will allow us to do this.

Remember don't forget to apply these baits to your private yards on June 9th and 10th.

## ARE YOU SUPPORTING YOUR LOCAL BURGLAR?

Surveys have shown that a surprising number of burglaries are committed by burglars who enter through unlocked doors or unsecured windows. One survey showed that in nearly one in three cases, thieves apparently gained entry without use of force.

Thieves have been at it again in our Community, so here are some suggestions.

Lock your door with a key. This means a dead bolt type lock -- it's worth it.

Lock your windows too; consider metal or wood rods for the tracks or your sliding windows.

Leave lights on when you go out.

Keep your garage door closed.

Be careful whom you tell that you are going to be away.

Be a good neighbor. Keep an eye on your neighbor's house if they are away for an extended time. Report to Community Center or Sheriff if you see an unknown person moving about in the neighbor's yard in a suspicious manner.

### TOP RANKED USKA COMPETITOR AND INSTRUCTOR:

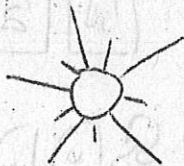

## SWIM TESTS

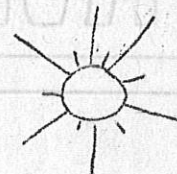

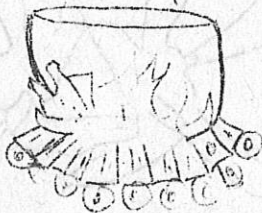

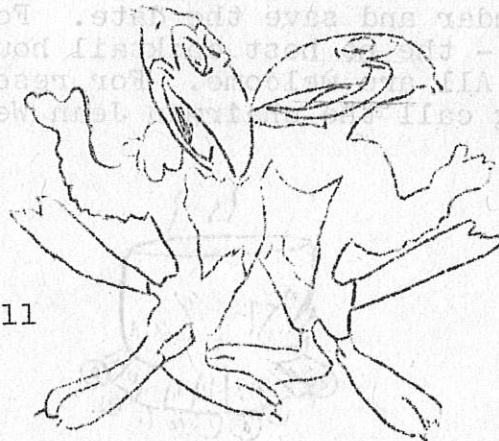
