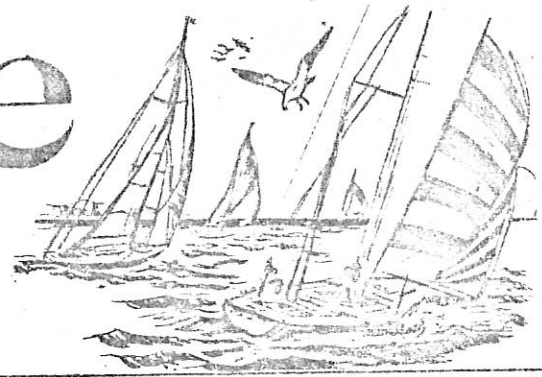

NOTICE TO MEMBERS

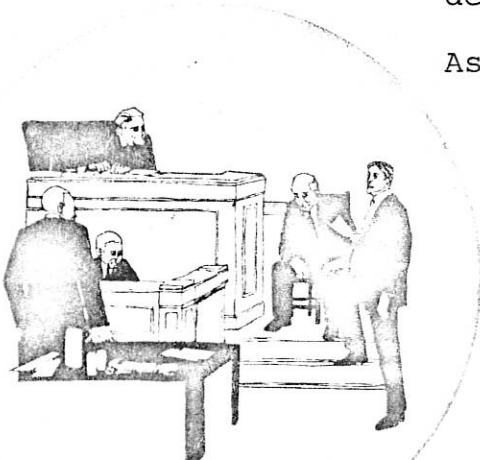
We are experiencing vandalism to our landscape sprinkler systems. You can help.

CURRENT COMMITTEES WERE ASKED TO "STAND".



DURING MAY, OVER 170 CITATIONS OR WARNING VIOLATIONS WERE ISSUED BY OUR SECURITY PATROL.

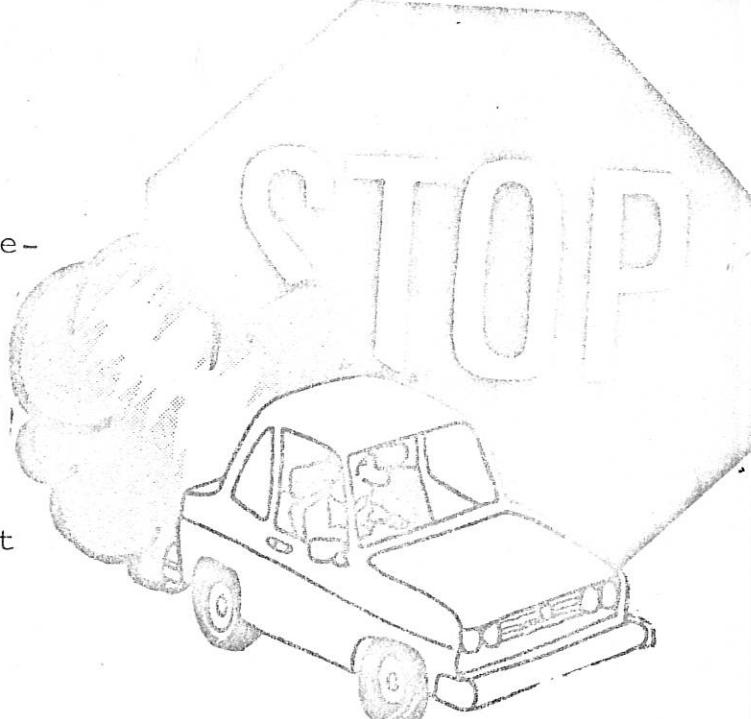

The Sea Terrace Townehomes Association I, Board of Directors has recently signed an agreement with the Modern Homes Company to install additional attic insulation, wrap all heater ducts and provide low flow showerheads free of charge for all Townehomes I owners. All homeowners should have received a letter with a form to sign and return, requesting the installation of these items. Work is scheduled to start the last week in May and take 4 to 6 weeks.

The program is financed by the Southern California Gas Company through a rebate program, which covers all costs.

Should any homeowner have questions concerning the program, the installation procedure or workmanship, he or she should contact John Horne at 496-8525.

Because of an increasing concern among homeowners in Sea Terrace Townehomes I, regarding the exterior paint colors presently in use, the Board of Directors has voted to send out a questionnaire to all homeowners. The questionnaire will have specific questions and a place for written comments. It is hoped that homeowners will cooperate in the endeavor and return the completed forms as soon as possible. The information from the questionnaire should provide the Board with sufficient data to establish a policy which will reflect the wishes of the majority of homeowners, in regard to the painting of our Townehomes.

All interested players are asked to fill out the form below and return it to the NSCA office by June 15. We will probably be limited to approximately 60 players, so please sign in early.

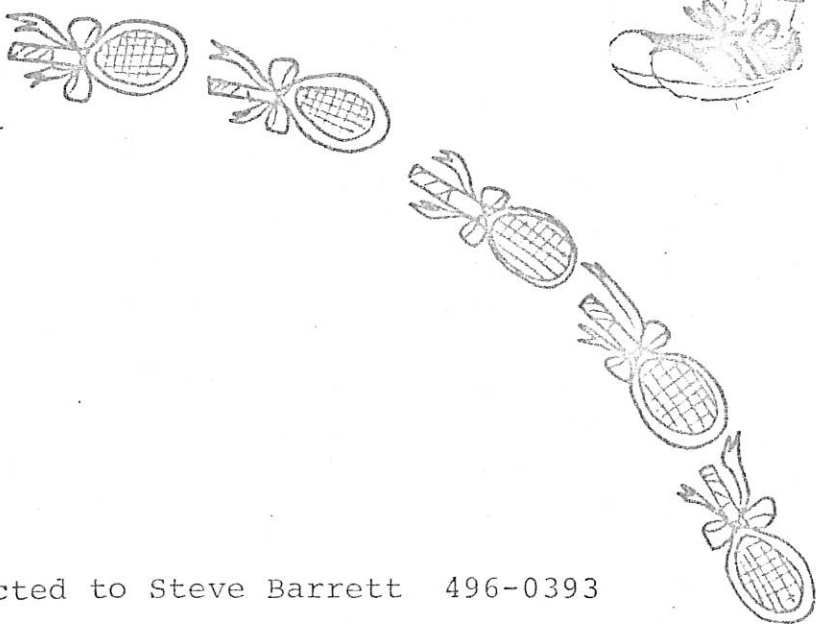

Falling in love with 'soft tennis'

"Soft tennis" has all the right stuff for the trendy and the health-conscious: It comes from Japan, it isn't sex- or age-biased, it's great exercise, and in Southern California it's hotter than a brush fire.

The hybrid sport combines traditional tennis rules with new equipment: lighter, slightly smaller, more loosely strung rackets and squishy, inflatable hollow balls (usually green or orange). The result is a game of less strain, because the ball travels much more slowly than in traditional tennis.

Soft tennis, played on a regular tennis court, is already popular in Florida and some West Coast states. It's being introduced to the rest of the USA by Chatsworth, Calif., manufacturer and distributor Avant Garde.

Although Avant Garde will not give exact figures, firm owner and president Jim Barney says sales are up "a thousand percent" over this time last year. Barney says he has taken orders from across the USA.

Soft tennis rackets are much cheaper than tennis rackets — from about \$22 to \$40 (for top-of-the-line graphite). Regular rackets range from about \$30 for standard wood models to \$300 for graphite. Soft tennis balls, on the other hand, cost about twice as much as their standard counterparts — about \$10 for a pack of three — but are guaranteed for six months.

"Definitely by this summer we will see a surge in the game," Barney says. He has arranged for the four soft tennis world champions to travel to

the Los Angeles area from Japan for a July tournament against four of the USA's best players.

"We have some tremendous players in the L.A. area," he says, adding that most players appreciate the slower ball and longer rallies.

"You're able to get to the ball more easily. It really teaches patience and consistency," Barney says. "We think that besides soft tennis creating an altogether new sport, it will also bring people back into tennis. My wife stopped playing tennis because she said she never won, but now she loves soft tennis and is thinking about starting to play regular tennis again."

Bob Fullerton, tennis director and head pro at the Peninsula Racquet Club in Rancho Palos Verdes, Calif., is using the game to teach kids traditional tennis.

"It's extremely fun. You rip the heck out of the ball, and it stays in the court. You are forced to swing up and through the ball because it's lighter and softer. ... That's a good tool for regular tennis. It's very similar to playing tennis on a clay court."

Fullerton and other aficionados note that soft tennis is the great equalizer — even when players slam the ball it doesn't go as far, so returns are easier. That makes it an ideal candidate for mixed doubles and family outings.

... The game is longer than tennis, Fullerton notes. "It's a tremendous amount of exercise — probably more than regular tennis — but definitely easier to play."
