PET RULES RESTATED

The community's pet rules are being published to refresh veteran residents and to acquaint new residents with the regulations. The rules have been adopted by the community.

1. **DOGS:** All dogs are required to be leashed. No leash to exceed six feet. Dog owners must comply with all sanitary practices and control the dog so as not to destroy, ruin or otherwise damage lawns, planted areas, trees or other properties. (a). Orange County Ordinance No. 2159, Sec. 41,042.

2. Will enforce canine rules based on following regulations:
1. Dogs must be on leashes at all times when out of doors, in compliance with Orange County Regulations: Ordinance No. 2159 which states all dogs must be on a leash not over 6 feet long, with the master on the other end of the leash. 2. It is owner's responsibility to pick up after his own dog. 3. Never leave paper towels, napkins, kleenex, other material or droppings. 4. DO NOT disturb your neighbors by leaving your pets alone for long periods of time to bark. 5. Vicious dogs, who attack other pets or humans, shall not be permitted. Dogs are allowed to walk wherever residents walk (except posted areas, swimming pools, clubhouses), provided the owner picks up after the dog.

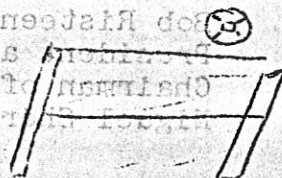

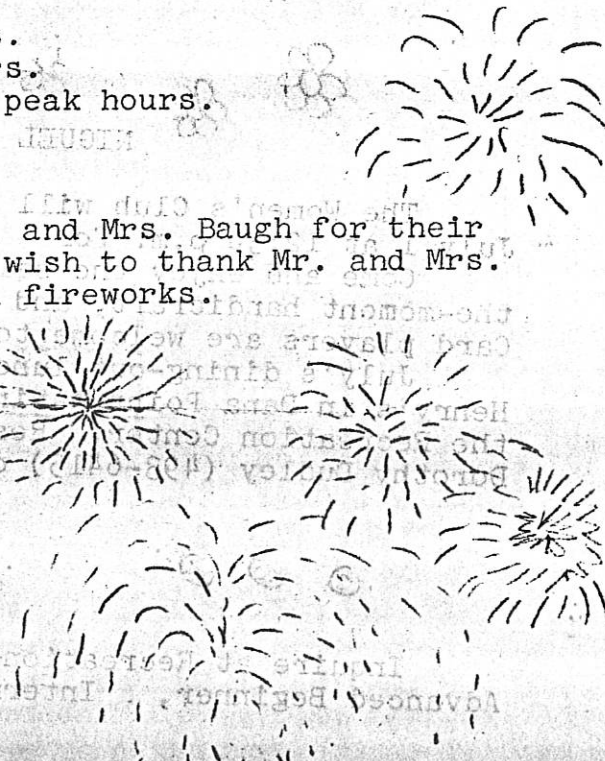
SECURITY REPORT
