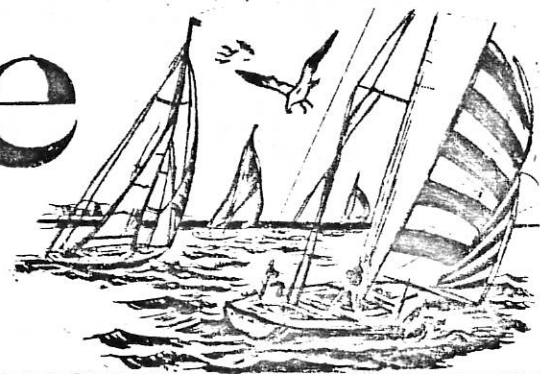

## FROM THE HELM:

When the Board is asked, "What did you accomplish in June?", we reply:

Committee Member We approved the appointment of Marian Walters to the Architectural Control Committee.

Budget Guidelines We set 5% increase as the guideline to be used by committee chairmen in preparing their 1985 budget requests.

Rewards We approved one reward of \$50. and two of \$25. each to the persons who helped management apprehend those who vandalized our sprinkler system.

Community Center Lighting We approved the expenditure of \$4100. to replace the missing outside lighting fixtures around the Community Center and to install and test a new type small fluorescent bulb in them. This cost will be offset by the \$2250. budgeted for this purpose and by an estimated \$1850. saving in the electricity budget caused by the fact that we budgeted for an expected rate increase that was delayed.

Breakers Isle Palm Trees We agreed to postpone discussion of the request of Breakers Isle owners to plant palm trees across the street from their houses until the July 18th open meeting.

Seashore News We agreed with the Communications Committee that we would mail to non-resident owners those pages of the Seashore News selected by the committee.

Shores Gate We agreed to discuss proposed changes at the July 18th open meeting.

Selva Gate We agreed to discuss proposed changes at the July 18th open meeting.

Water Bill We decided to cover the unexpected increase in water costs for the remainder of the year by (1) deferring the Vista Grande Slope project, (2) deferring the office telephone purchase plan, and (3) deferring part of the Garden/Shores entry structures project. The increase in water costs is caused by an unexpected increase in rate (26% instead of 16%), an increase in water use, and the delay in receiving the cheaper reclaimed water.

Meeting Room We experimented with a new arrangement of chairs, tables and lectern for the open meeting. To see what we did, come to the July 18th meeting.

## COMMUNITY ACTION

### VANDALISM/REWARD

Over the last eight weeks, this Association has experienced "Vandalism" to its Landscape Sprinklers. Last month in this newsletter, we asked for your assistance in catching those responsible for this unnecessary act and considerable expense to the Association. Not only must the sprinkler parts be replaced at a substantial expense, but considerable employee time is lost which results in other important work being delayed or left undone.

I am pleased to report that due to information received from two young members of our community and based upon a subsequent eye witness report by an employee of our Landscape Contractor, those responsible have been identified and the vandalism appears to have stopped. Young grade school age boys within our community were responsible.

At the June 20th Board of Directors' meeting, rewards were recommended and approved, payable to these three individuals. Checks and letters of appreciation are currently being processed.

As an exception to policy, in lieu of pursuing reimbursement from the parents of the youths responsible for this vandalism, the Board has agreed to a "work project." within the community. With the consent of the parents, the boys will perform work beneficial to the Association.

Recently, we have had a number of children "hanging around" or playing in and around the Newspaper Shed. We have noted evidence of their use of matches, etc. "No" loitering near this building will be permitted. Violators will be deciplined.

We urge all community members to be alert to vandalism - report such acts - it is expensive!

## MANAGER'S REPORT

SUMMER IS HERE!!! It hardly seems possible --- it came upon us so soon.

This month I would like to make a few general comments to all residents which seem timely.

Mariner Entry Security Phone ---- We annually change the phone number of Security at the Mariner entrance. This is done to minimize unauthorized calls and unauthorized admittance to Niguel Shores. When you receive the new phone number in a special mailing, please keep it confidential and do not give it out to unauthorized persons.

Beach Parking Lot Use ---- Residents are requested NOT to authorize entry to this community and beach parking lot indiscriminately. Remember, beach parking is reserved for members/residents and their invited guests. If residents permit any and all non-resident, non-member use of the lot -- parking for members/residents may be severly limited on, or we may have none at all.


Beach Parking Levels/Restrictions ---- Remember, parking at the beach in lower levels one(1) and (2) is reserved for vehicles which display an owner or tenant decal (permitted residents only). No guest/day pass parking. The upper levels for such parking are posted.

Holiday Parking ---- Every "Holiday" seems to make special control of the beach parking lot necessary. Please cooperate with security in their efforts to control the area.

Tow-Aways ---- Niguel Shores tows away vehicles in violation of parking rules. Do not take a chance -- park properly. Tow aways cost owners \$75.00 and up. Be sure your guests are aware of and abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Association concerning vehicle operation, parking, use of the Community Center, etc. You are responsible for their acts and conduct while in the community.

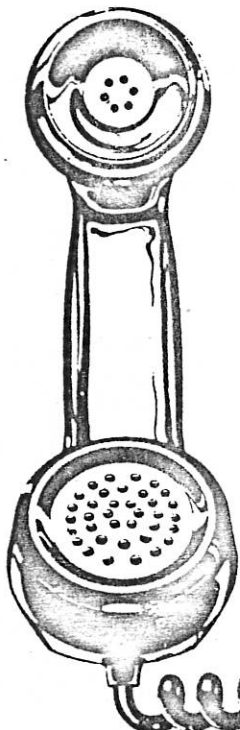
Remember ---- Guests staying with you for "a few days" - "for a week or so", or using your residence in your absence need to be pre-registered with the office. In most cases a "special entry" vehicle entry pass will be issued. If you intend for guests staying here to use the facilities (pool, jacuzzi, etc.), you must give the office a written permission slip. Call the office at 493-0122 to coordinate such matters. Arrangements made in advance will minimize problems for your guests and our administration.

OUR NEW WORD PROCESSOR GOES TO WORK -----

In April, the Board approved the purchase of a Sanyo, IBM-compatible Word Processor, having in mind that one of the main uses would be the preparation of copy for the Seashore News.

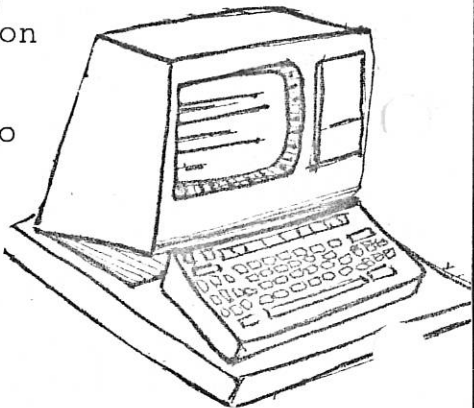
The Communications Committee is happy to announce that this "Electronic Marvel" will shortly go to work for all of us. Staff training is under way, and before long the machine will be working full time to pay off its \$3800 purchase price. If all goes as planned, we should have our first Seashore News off the processor by October 1, 1984.

In producing the Seashore News, the machine's most useful features are its wide choice of type styles, its ability to produce text with straight right-hand margins, its ease of correcting, changing and adding text and its ability to search out spelling errors. Also, its compatibility with IBM software opens the door to many other useful programs.

In addition to producing copy for the Seashore News, the Processor will speed up the production of letters, committee rules and regulations, traffic reports, membership records and many other Association documents. All this leads to improved efficiency in the enforcement of traffic, security and CC&R regulations.

Controller Keith Lavery is already using the Processor to improve his financial reporting.

All in all, the Processor is fully expected to upgrade our work, speed up production and save staff time and money as the effort continues to improve communications throughout the Association.

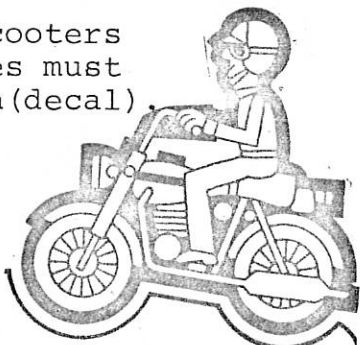

The first five and one-half months of 1984 have produced 77 tons of scrap paper to be recycled, a total of 154,000 pounds, or almost 8000 pounds per week. This is a very acceptable total for a community of 960 homes. We can feel proud of our contribution toward the National Ecological effort. At the present price of \$35 per ton, we are generating almost \$500 per month, all of which is being used on various projects beneficial to our community and for which our annual budget has not provided funds.

An ad hoc committee is presently working on the idea of adding a conference room to the north end of the office building. If the Board eventually agrees to proceed, the Recycled Paper Fund will be able to fund a portion of the cost.

At this writing, our recycling program has accumulated a fund of almost \$10,000 so, keep those papers coming!

To you new residents, please join with us in saving newspapers, magazines, brochures, phone books and junk mail. Just tie them, or place them in large grocery bags and cartons and deliver them to our storage building on the west side of Community Center, open 7 days a week, from 9:00am to 9:00pm.

Guppies    ages 3-4 years

Children afraid to put face in the water, and those who do not know how to swim.

We teach you how to improve your other strokes and introduce you to breast stroke, side stroke and Build indurance.

Swimmers    12,13,14,15,16

Must be able to perform in the free style, back stroke, breast stroke, elementary back stroke, side stroke, We will help you to perfect these strokes and build endurance. Also introduce you to basic lifesaving.

Junior Lifesaving

Students must be 16 years old and an excellent swimmer in all strokes to pass this course. Although children 14 and 15 are encouraged to take the course.

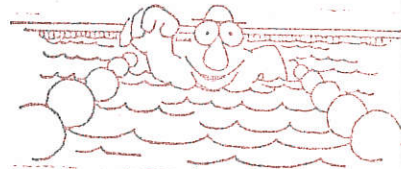
