

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Going away on a summer vacation? Planning to go to the beach more often and to stay later these long summer days? If you are, it might be a good idea to consider how burglar-resistant your home is. The long days of summer are an inviting time for would-be burglars, particularly juvenile types. In many cases, an easily accessible home is an open invitation for kids out for easy money or just a thrill.

According to law enforcement experts, three principles to keep in mind in order to discourage burglars are: (1) deterrence, (2) delay, and (3) detection. Deterrence is best provided by effective dead-bolt type locks on all exterior doors and windows. They are not expensive to install and they eliminate the opportunity for an easy burglary.

Delaying a burglar up to four minutes is considered sufficient to discourage the attempted break-in. Most burglars want to avoid the noise of breaking glass or smashing a door because the noise attracts attention. Good locks just make it much more difficult and time consuming to risk trying to break in.

By delaying the potential burglar, the possibility of detection is increased. Alarms on doors and windows are an effective way to detect a burglar, but alert and watchful neighbors are uniquely effective in detecting burglars. And this is what Neighborhood Watch is all about. Neighbors who are watchful and who will call the Sheriff's Office when they observe suspicious activity in the neighborhood provide our best insurance against the crime of burglary. It follows that it is in the best interest of all of us to join together to make Neighborhood Watch work this summer in our community.
