RACKING ON COURT ONE

1. Rackers should sit quietly on the bench while waiting for the court.
2. If players are waiting, you may play one set with a five minute warm-up. (If score should reach 6 all, you must play a 9 point tie breaker) or you may practice for 30 minutes.
3. If a set is in progress, players should announce game score to arriving rackers (or how much time is left of 30 minutes practice).
4. Thirty minutes practice time begins when you start play, not when a racker arrives.

First in line for racking have priority for unscheduled times or no shows on courts 2,3 and 4 and may use total time available singles, 45 minutesdoubles 90 minutes.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

If you have ONE morning a week (including Saturdays not Sundays) to make a FIRM COMMITMENT to work and play with Vietnamese children at Camp Pendleton from now through September or October please come to a meeting Tuesday, August 5th at 3 pm at the Rec. Center.

Anyone from age 16 and up is welcome...however, I will caution you that it can be strenuous activity in Play School working with 3 to 6 year olds in "make-shift" surroundings! Teenagers could take Saturdays so it wouldn't mean a change when school starts. And Fathers are welcome, too!

Play School volunteers (6 to 10 per day with a Team Leader) work with from 100 to 250 children age 3 to 6 from 9 am to 12 noon. You will have Vietnamese teenagers, who speak and understand a little English, to help you with the children. You teach songs, games, colors, fruits, parts of clothing, animals and crafts, etc....just as one would with American pre-schoolers....except you do need to make teaching aids to help overcome the language barrier. Also needed would be "one or two timers" that could perform for all 100 to 200 children....musicians, magicians, a traveling flea circus, etc!....something special for 3 to 6 year olds.

The logistics to get volunteers on the base each week excludes the curious or the uncommitted, please...only those really interested in helping on a regular basis (except for the volunteers for special shows).

Despite how you feel about Vietnam and the refugees being brought here.... they are here, and these children are so eager to learn! Help if you can. It's great, try it, you'll like it!

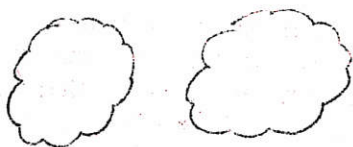
