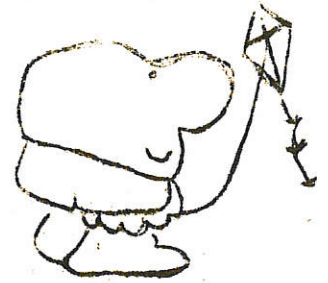

GARDEN HOME RESIDENTS PLEASE COOPERATE

The developer has provided a minimum of guest parking spaces within the several bays; for less than one per residence. Adequate off street parking is provided however in the form of two car garages and driveways that will accomodate another two cars.

Any resident that habitually uses a guest parking space while using his garage for other purposes is making disproportionate use of common facilities. He forces guests to park curb side to the inconvenience of neighbors which in some cases prevents entry to their garages.

Swimming Pool Rules Reminder..... As of Monday, September 15th, the Community Center pool will no longer have a lifeguard on duty. It is very important that all members obey the following swimming pool rules for their safety and others.

1. No member or guest is permitted in the pool area or center ground prior to 7:30 or after 9:00 pm.

2. Children must be 12 years old or in the 7th grade in order to go swimming without adult accompaniment.

3. Showers are requested by all pool and jacuzzi users.

4. All persons with hair that touches shoulders when wet must wear a rubberband or bathing cap.

5. Swim suits must be worn by persons using the pool. No cut-offs or street clothing.

6. Dangerous practices prohibited: pool users may not run on decks; climb on, sit, jump from fences or other structures or dive in shallow water. Horseplay or wrestling on decks, ladders, springboards in the pool, or in dressing room is prohibited.

7. All persons must obey rules and request by the center personnel.
