So many people asked about the chicken recipe Saturday night. Here it is - straight from our Hawaiian kitchen!

TERIYAKI CHICKEN

- 1 Cup soy sauce
- 1 Cup sugar
- 2 Tablespoons sake, gin or sherry
- 1 Teaspoon salt
- 1 Teaspoon accent
- ½ Teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ Teaspoon pepper
- 2 Cloves minced garlic

Combine ingredients. Stir marinade well and while doing so, pour over 2 cut-up chickens, marinate 2 hours. Remove chicken from marinade. Barbeque chicken over coals or in 350 oven for 1 hour. While baking, brush chicken with left-over marinade every 15 minutes.

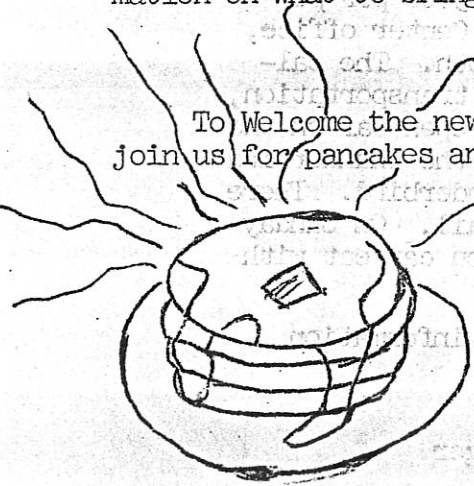

SECURITY COMMITTEE REPORT

Those who attended the July 6 meeting of the Board of Directors will recall that the Board approved several recommendations of the Security Committee. Since it takes time to accomplish improvements of this type, we thought you would appreciate receiving a status report as of August 26.

New Vehicle Stickers

We have decided on attractive new stickers which we believe will be more visible and more durable than the present ones. The stickers were designed and will be provided, at a reasonable price, by Ed Bieschke, a resident of Sea Terrace II. We expect to install the new stickers on your vehicles in October.

New Spikes

New heavy duty spikes will be installed in the Shores and Selva exits. We hope to have these installed within two weeks.

24 Hour Manned Gate

After the new spikes are installed at the Shores and Selva gates, we intend to make certain adjustments which will permit the manning of the Mariner gate full time (24 hours per day, seven days per week.)

New Temporary Passes

We plan to get new temporary passes which can be attached in a location inside a vehicle and readily seen.

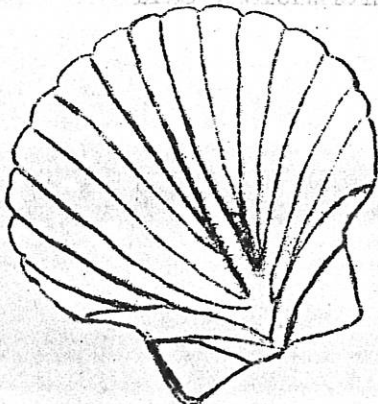
Stonehill Barrier

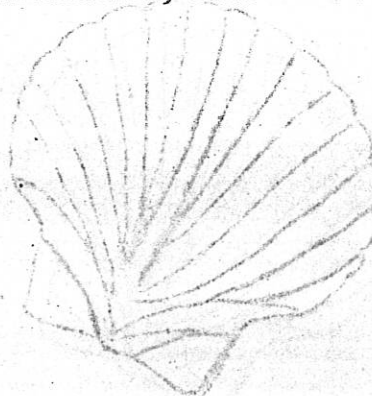
SLIM & TRIM
