FROM THE HELM

Happy New Year from your Board of Directors and from the staff. We hope '97 was a good year for you and that '98 will be even better. We feel that way about the Shores, too. This is a time to not only look forward to the coming year, but to also review what we've done.

The first thing this Board did in June was to make a list of things we wanted to get done in our administrative year. There were twenty-four items. Here's what we've accomplished so far.

- ◆ We've completed the paving in the Villas and in Sea Terrace II.
- ◆ We've completed the new gates at Manta and at Garibaldi.
- ◆ The beach bluff fence is in place and the gate access system will be installed within 60 days.
- ◆ We've had a consultant give us an analysis of our insurance risks and feel the Association is carrying the proper insurance.
- ◆ We've had an outside consultant examine the bridge over PCH, and we're assured it's in good condition with a useful life of thirty to fifty years.
- ◆ We've established new lien enforcement procedures and published them.
- ◆ We've agreed on the design for the Breakers Isle gate renovation and have asked for bids.
- ◆ We convened an ad hoc committee to review our By-laws and are taking steps to implement their recommendations.
- ◆ We convened an ad hoc committee to study the issue of vandalism in the community. We've just received their report and are considering their recommendations.

- ◆ We reorganized the staff and hired a new Community Relations Manager and a new Administrative Assistant.
- ◆ We hired a consultant to help us write job descriptions for each staff position and provide us a new process for performance evaluations.
- ◆ We purged the files for the Association, cleaned up the office and built in storage shelves.
- ◆ We've made repairs to streets in a large area of the community and will be applying road slurry seal, as weather permits, in January.
- ◆ We asked for volunteers to help us with a number of these projects and received several replies. Thanks to those of you who've donated your time and talent.

Obviously there are a number of projects we're working on but haven't completed yet. In the coming months I'll update the list.

As we look forward to 1998 and the final five months of this Board's tenure, our goal is to complete all the items on our list. But these are just the special projects we identified back in June. In addition, the full time job of running the Association continues day by day. We hope you continue to enjoy living in Niguel Shores.

Incidentally, those of you who didn't attend the Christmas Carol sing-along on December 21 should have. It was great. I counted 70 people there, including a half-dozen pre-schoolers. It was festive and fun. We'll do it again next season, so plan to be there.

Again, best wishes for a happy 1998.

BOARD ACTIONS FOR DECEMBER

- ✓ Accepted the renovation design of the proposed Breakers Isle entry/exit gate. Bids will be sought for the work.
- ✓ Accepted the renovation design for the Womens Locker Room and agreed to post the plan for homeowner comment.
- ✓ Denied a homeowner's request for waiver of late charge and interest because extraordinary circumstances were not shown.
- ✓ Accepted a bid from GE Supply for 25 tapered ten foot concrete light poles at a cost of \$14,250. Most of these will replace crumbling poles within Broadmoor Homes.
- ✓ Accepted the additional cost for asphalt street repairs, amounting to \$6,651, from Anchor Paving.
- ✓ Authorized staff and Securtec to use a "one-time" vehicle parking pass for guests attending a resident's home, after the office receives a guest list. The pass allows the guest to enter the Association one time and to park near the resident's home. The pass does not allow the guest to leave the Association and re-enter.
- ✓ Authorized staff to notify Securtec to change the patrol hours.
- ✓ Denied a homeowner's request to receive an additional keycard.
- ✓ Approved several new policies: Cash Management Policy; Replacement [reserves] Fund Policy; and a Capitalization Policy.
- ✓ Approved the Landscape Committee's request for funding of improvements for the slope area at the intersection of Selva Road and La Cresta Drive, below Sea Terrace II homes. The cost of improvements will be approximately \$3,500.
- ✓ Referred the issue of changing electric rates/service providers, effective 1/1/98, to the Finance Committee for review and recommendation.
- ✓ Accepted the Traffic & Safety Committee's recommendation to install locking devices on the beach pedestrian access gate and the two gates at the Community Center. Staff is working on specific costs for this project.

ASPHALT ROAD SLURRY TO BE APPLIED STARTING JANUARY 6

All residents should have received a letter in December advising of this work. The letter also discussed the tentative schedule in which the work will proceed. The contractor expects this project to take a total of seven days. The weather will be the biggest factor in keeping to the schedule.

As a reminder, the road slurry will only be applied in the following areas of the community:

Berkus Homes
Sea Terrace I
Shores Garden Homes
Custom Homes

STREETS WITH ROAD SLURRY APPLIED WILL BE CLOSED FOR 24 HOURS

Road slurry will not be applied to the asphalt streets within Broadmoor Homes or Atlantic Garder Homes because these areas are scheduled to receive asphalt overlays later in 1998. Road slurry will be applied in the Fall of 1998 to the streets within the Villas and Sea Terrace II.

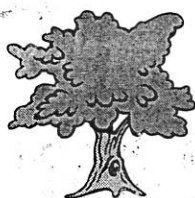
VEHICLES PARKED IN THE WAY OF THE CREW WILL BE TOWED AT THE VEHICLE OWNER'S EXPENSE

The crew will start each day at 8:00 am, thus all vehicles must be out of your garage and not parked on the common areas where the crew is scheduled to work. The NSCA staff will do everything possible to distribute new schedule notices if the weather changes. Notices will be placed on each home's front door and the office staff will have an up-to-date list posted at the Community Center.

Residents are asked to be careful when driving on the new road slurry for approximately seven to ten days. When turning your steering wheel, be sure your vehicle is moving forward. Turning the steering wheel without moving or fast acceleration will cause deep marks on the road slurry.

LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE UPDATE



During 1998, the Committee will not be doing many improvement projects. The few projects scheduled will occur in May and June.

At this writing, the Landscape Committee is seeking approval from the Board to expend approximately \$3,500 to improve the slope corner at Selva Road and La Cresta below the Sea Terrace II homes. The plan calls for installation of four additional trees and colorful shrubs. The soil conditions at this corner consist of heavy clay, thus it may be difficult for the shrubs to flourish. Every effort will be made to encourage successful growth.

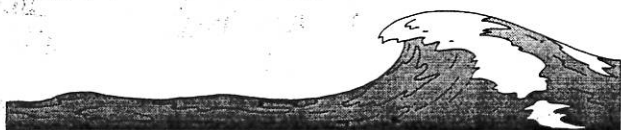

Your committee will be meeting in January to plan events for the year. We welcome suggestions.

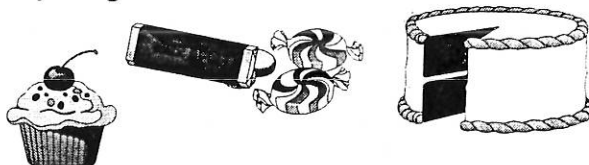
THANK YOU

RE-ROOFING?

READ ON, IT COULD SAVE YOU MONEY AND AGGRAVATION

When re-roofing, even if only replacing the existing roof with exactly what is on there now, it is necessary to get the approval of the Architectural Control Committee. Failure to do so **PRIOR** to re-roofing could cost you a \$100.00 fine. Plus, you may even be subject to being required to remove an unacceptable material and replace it with an approved material. The method to avoid problems and hassle is simple:

1) Pick up an Architectural Control Committee submittal form at the Niguel Shores Office. It wouldn't hurt to check the rules to see if the material you are planning to use is generally approved here in the Shores.

2) Fill in the blanks and submit back to the office with **either samples or a printed brochure of the material you are contracting/planning to use (including color designation)**.

3) The Architectural Control Committee has 45 days to respond but generally a response can be expected at one of the next two twice-a-month meetings.

4) Please remember that the Committee only approves aesthetics and does not make nor is it responsible for engineering or structural evaluations. If you pick a particularly heavy roofing material you might be well advised to check and make sure that your roof structure is designed to withstand the extra weight.

5) One last but important item. The City of Dana Point requires a permit and inspection for re-roofing. Failure to obtain a City permit prior to construction incurs a penalty which doubles its cost. (We do not choose to second guess the City so we do not know what other problems failure to get a permit might create.) For permits contact Jim Lawrence of the Building Division at (714) 248-3590.

Now that your ready to re-roof please make sure that you or your Contractor put up the Niguel Shores approval card as well as the City permit. It could save you unnecessary expenditure in the long run.
