

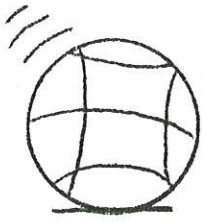
LADIES VOLLEYBALL

DRAW HAT MIXED DOUBLES RESULTS

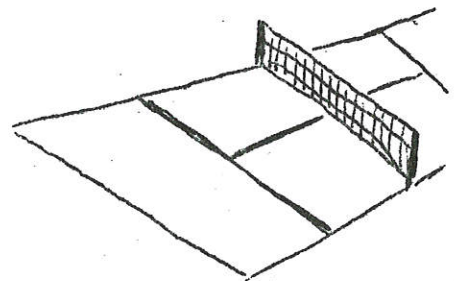




SCUBA DIVING INSTRUCTION

SCUBA instruction will be given on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 beginning October 3, 1973. Charlie Gibbs of Underwater Educators will offer beginning and advanced classes to all those 14 years old and older. A fee of \$45.00 will include lessons in the Community Center pool, two open-water checkouts and all the necessary equipment.


The use of skin and SCUBA diving equipment will be taught. Oceanographs, marine life and first aid are a few of the subjects taught. Upon successful completion of the final written exam and open-water checkout, the student will receive a NAUI and PADI certification card.

BEGINNING SPANISH!

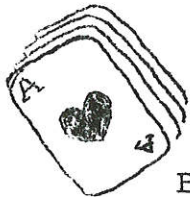
Dr. Boarino of Cal State Fullerton will teach a conversational Spanish class at the Center commencing October 25th at 7:00PM. Sign up now!



HALLOWEEN POTLUCK

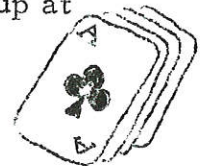
