

SELVA GATE SOON TO OPEN

Final work is now in progress on the installation of a wrought iron gate. It is expected to be in full operation no later than October 15. Entrance will require the use of your existing key card. Exit will be by underground loop detectors. This will require you to drive between two painted guidelines on the asphalt and wait for the gate to open. Be careful not to drive past the painted guide line as the exit gate opens inward, and either will not open or it will open and come in contact with your car. Read instruction posted at gate carefully before attempting exit. As soon as the exact date of opening is known it will be communicated to the community.

NIGUEL SHORES WOMEN'S CLUB



LADIES DAY TENNIS

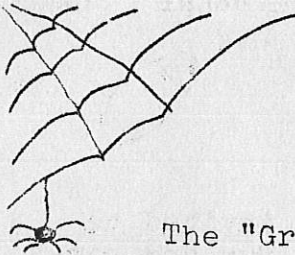
Ladies Day Tennis will be Thursday mornings. Starting time is 9:30. Play will continue until 12:00. This time is scheduled for intermediate and advanced players.

PENNY CARNIVAL



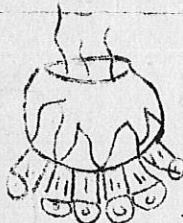

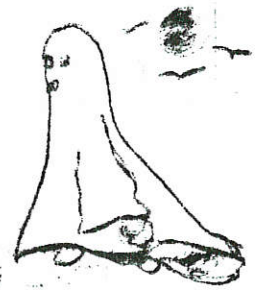


