GENERAL BALLOT

SPECIAL STATEWIDE ELECTION

Niguel Shores residents are encouraged to participate in a voting for a special tax and expenditure limitation measure on November 6th at the Community Center. The ballot is an initiative to limit state expenditures; restricting use of defined surplus revenue to tax reductions, refunds or emergencies. The measure constitutionally eliminates personal income tax for lower income persons, reduces others' 1973 tax up to 20% from surplus and reduces subsequent year rates 7-1/2%. Further information and additional limitations may be obtained on the individual ballot. Voters will also be electing sanitation and water district board members. Those who have any questions about registration may call the Voter Registration Department at 834-2244.

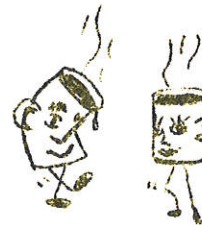


COFFEE CLATCH



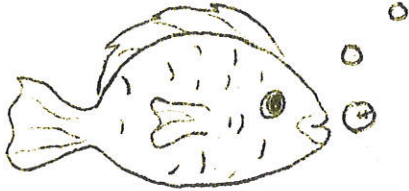

COFFEE CLATCH DANCE

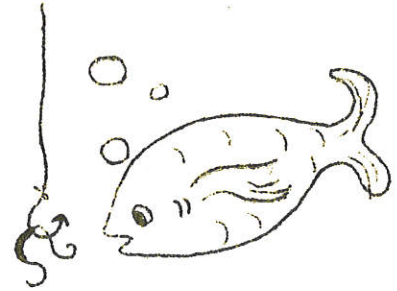

BASKETBALL GOALS INSTALLED

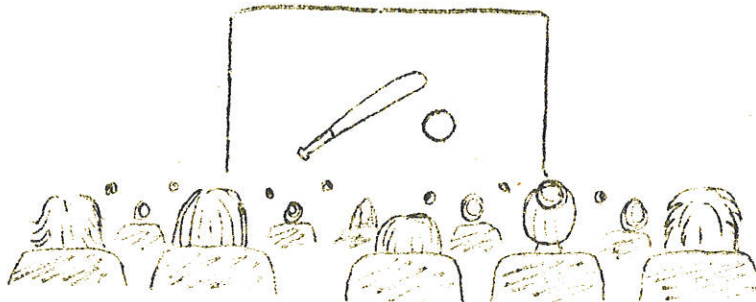

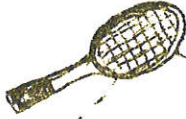
"Y"-INDIAN GUIDES

"UNWRITTEN" RULES OF TENNIS ETIQUETTE

- I. Proper attitude - Fairness in calling the game as well as complimenting good play sets a positive atmosphere for both players.
- II. Know the rules - A thorough playing knowledge of the rules makes a more efficient game.
- III. Dress the part - Wear appropriate athletic attire.
- IV. Meet your match - Play someone near your own ability unless you are invited to play with superior players as in mixed doubles.
- V. Avoid stalling - It is considered bad form to "stall" for a breather during a match.
- VI. Calling serves - In case of doubt, give your opponent the benefit of call.
- VII. Replay of fast service - It is the responsibility of the server to be sure the receiver is ready.
- VIII. Crossing courts - Do not interrupt or distract play on adjacent courts until play has ceased.
- IX. When others are waiting - It is polite to wait outside court until either the match point is final or until your scheduled court time has arrived.
- X. Don't argue - Don't show irritation at a questionable opponent's call.
- XI. Control your temper - Concentrate on your game play not on your personal pride.
- XII. Side-line etiquette - Keep all noise and movement to a minimum.
