

At a special meeting of the Board of Directors held on Tuesday, October 19, 1976, your Directors approved the following changes in security for the Association:

- -Purchase of a similar but superior quality gate for the Shores entrance.
- -Reduce the guard coverage at the Shores entrance from 13 to 8 hours per day.
- -Provide 24 hour per day guard coverage at the Mariner entrance.
- -Chain closed the Shores entrance lane during the overnight hours.

Other Security improvements in process now include:

- -Heavy duty spikes to be installed in the exit lanes of both the Selva and Shores entrances.
- -Your Directors have met with AVCO in a spirit of cooperation. AVCO has agreed to replace the gate at Garibaldi with one of superior quality and install a locking system at the Selva gate entrance which will prevent forced entry.

As soon as the Shores gate and heavy duty spikes are installed we will inform you of the exact hours of guard coverage and gate closures in order that we don't have any confusion or misunderstandings.

Your Security Committee and Board of Directors will continue to monitor our system to determine if these changes have strengthened our overall community security. A roving patrol will need to be subject to budget considerations and the result of these new changes.

Views and trees continue to present a problem to many of our homeowners. The Board will attempt to speed up our tree trimming and thining program to solve some of these problems. However, with a new landscape contractor and much to be done quickly, there may be some delays — we hope not excessive.

The Board asks your cooperation in these matters. We have a fine community and we will keep it that way with the help of all our residents.

Due to Election Day, Tuesday, November 2nd, the next Board meeting has been rescheduled to Tuesday, November 9th at the Recreation Center.




To those of you who are thinking about cutting down or otherwise destroying trees that are hampering your view. DON'T

CHILDREN'S DANCE & MOVEMENT CLASS
