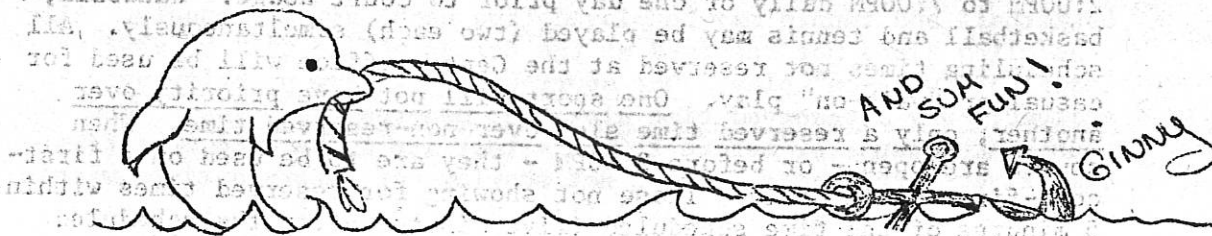

MULTI-PURPOSE COURTS BUSY

Due to traffic problems on the "handball" courts, a scheduling service will be provided in the Community Center office by calling 493-0122. Reservations may be made for one hour in duration from 2:00PM to 7:00PM daily or one day prior to court usage. Handball, basketball and tennis may be played (two each) simultaneously. All scheduling times not reserved at the Center office will be used for casual or "walk-on" play. One sport will not have priority over another; only a reserved time slot over non-reserved time. When courts are open - or before 2:00PM - they are to be used on a first-come-first-serve basis. Those not showing for reserved times within 5 minutes of the time scheduled (five minutes after the scheduled hour begins) will forfeit two weeks scheduling privileges (as in the use of the tennis courts). This rule will go into effect on December 1, 1973.

COMING SOON!

A six-week Hand Building Stoneware Pottery Class will be offered at the Community Center beginning January 14, 1974. The class will include instruction by artist Carol Reynolds in glazing, firing and much fun will be had in a variety of projects. The kiln firing and glaze work will be accomplished at Mrs. Reynolds' home in Laguna Niguel. 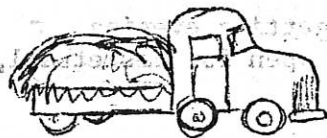
CHRISTMAS CHORAL PROGRAM

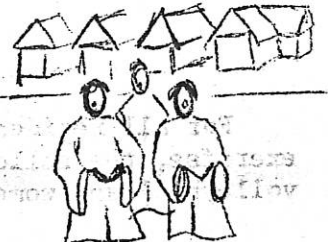


T.G.I.F. PARTY

AFTER SCHOOL RECREATION


Beginning December 3, 1973, an after school recreation program will take place at the Community Center. The program will consist of sports, games and crafts and will be held Monday through Friday from 3:30PM to 5:00PM. Arts and Crafts will be held once a week with all projects being made from materials which can be found around the home. Notice of the materials needed will be posted on the Center bulletin board. On Monday and Friday we will concentrate on special sports for girls, and on Tuesday and Thursday special sports for boys. There will be instruction in and games of football, basketball volleyball, volley-tennis, kickball, soccer and many more. On Wednesday afternoons we will have free play. All after school activities will be fully supervised by a qualified recreation leader. All children 8 years old or in the 3rd grade are encouraged to take part in the after school sports program and children of any age are invited to join the arts and crafts sessions.

For all residents who are interested in getting evening exercise, the following high school gyms are open for basketball, volleyball and women's physical fitness.

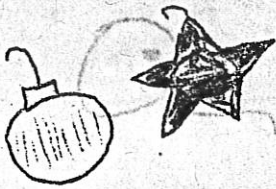

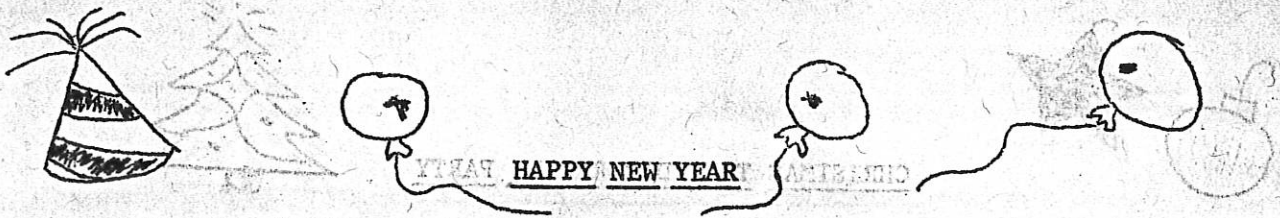
### CHRISTMAS TREES
