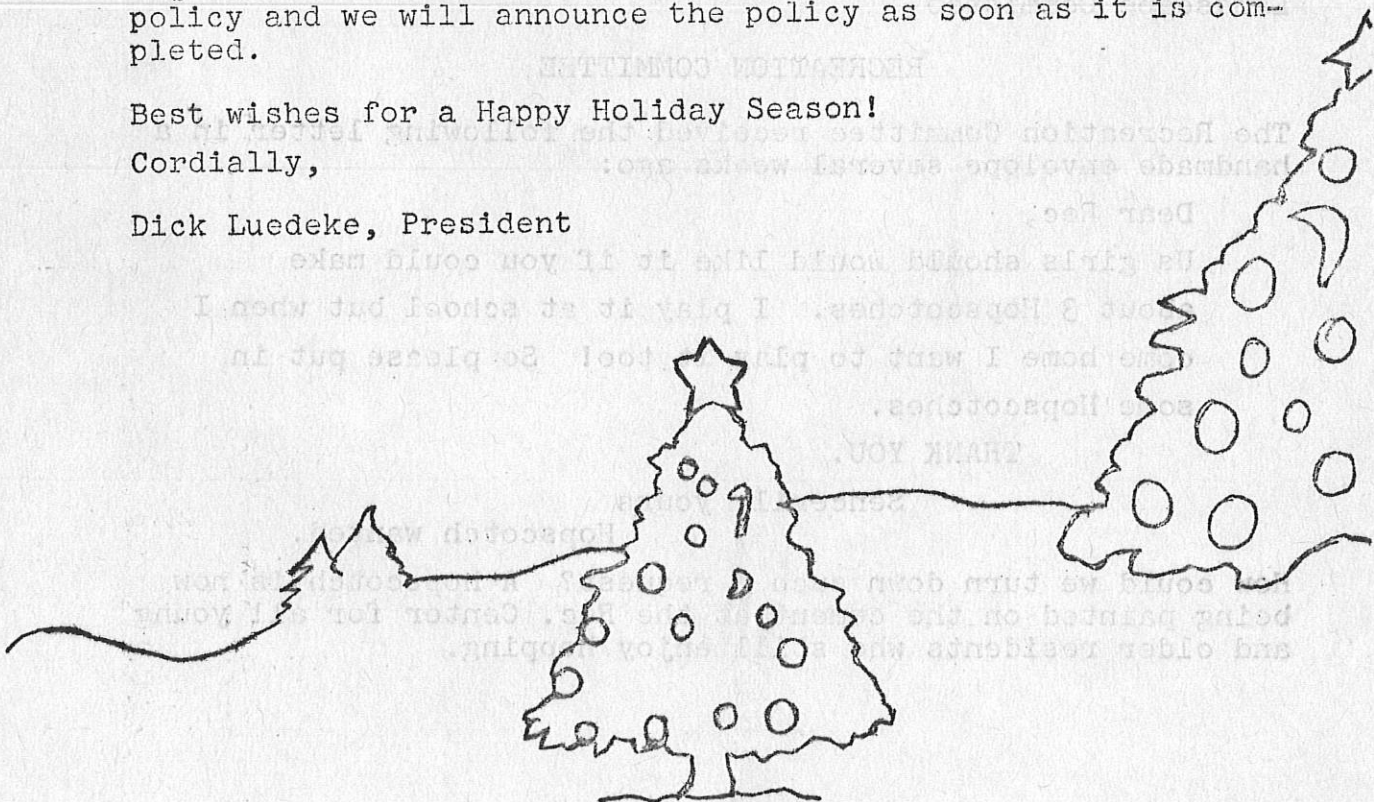
1. In support of the new headquarters building for the South Coast County Water District to be located adjacent to the county library presently under construction.

Your Board of Directors has recognized the concern many homeowners have regarding trees and views. We are currently working on a statement which will represent the Association's tree policy and we will announce the policy as soon as it is completed.

PROGRESS REPORT

NIGUEL SHORES LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE



Six weeks ago Roy Ikeda assumed the duties of Landscape Maintenance Contractor. In that short period of time significant progress has been achieved.

1. Our sprinkler system has been restored and is being upgraded with automatic timers replacing faulty manual clocks.
2. Lawns and greenbelts are greatly improved; fertilizers and pesticides are being applied wherever needed.
3. Tree-trimming is well under way with a crew working full time every day until the job is complete.
4. Streets and walkways are being cleaned; a street sweeper will be used on a regular schedule.
5. Slopes and common areas are being weeded. Trees are being restaked wherever required.
6. Replanting of ground cover and shrubs has been funded and is scheduled for December.

We appreciate the many calls and letters expressing your ideas and suggestions.

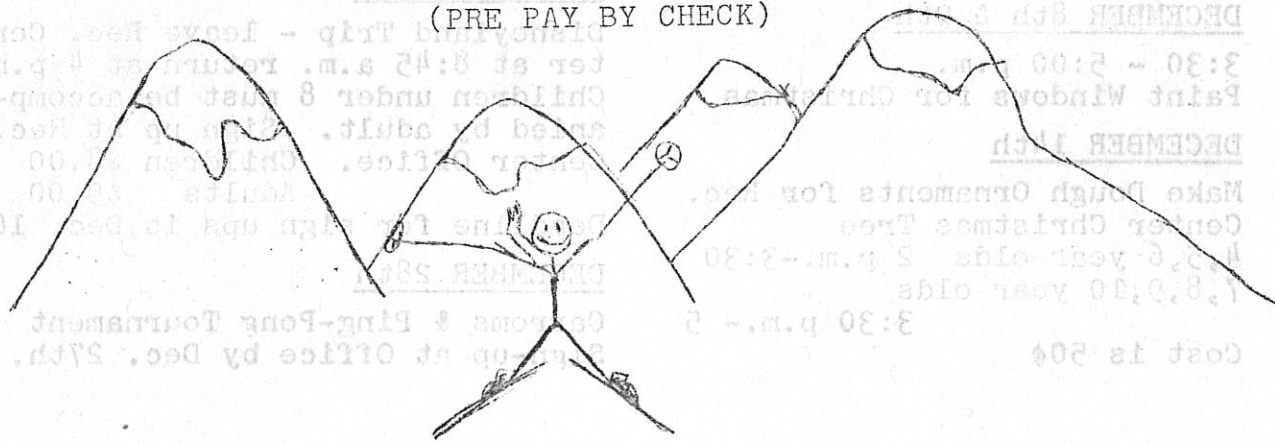

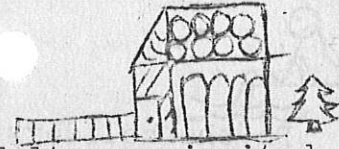

REFUSE REGULATIONS

Rubbish must be out by 6:00 a.m.

Total weight of container and contents not to exceed 50 pounds.

Household collection to maximum of six (6) 40 gallon containers. Newspapers may be placed in containers or bundled, not to exceed the 50 pound weight.

Cardboard barrels or oil drums are not legal containers. Metal trash cans, plastic cans or bags are O.K..

Newspapers, if not in a container, should be bundled and tied. Tree trimmings, if not in a container, should be tied into bundles not over four (4) feet in length or over two (2) feet in diameter, nor weigh over 50 pounds.

The following items will not be taken on regular route pick-ups; SOD, DIRT, ROCKS, OR ANY CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL, FURNITURE, APPLIANCES, PLASTERBOARD ETC., These may be handled as "SPECIAL PICK-UPS" and there is a minimum charge of five dollars (\$5.00). An estimate is given before doing the work.

ALL HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE SHOULD BE WRAPPED, (paper or plastic).

Ashes should be placed in bags, securely closed or in throw-away boxes, completely covered.

FLATTEN AND TIE EMPTY MOVING BOXES.

Spraying containers with an Ammonia solution is a deterrent to animals.

Do not leave toys or other objects near the trash, unless you want them removed.

We do not pick up on THANKSGIVING, CHRISTMAS OR NEW YEARS DAY. If one of these days falls on your scheduled day, your pick-up will be on the following SATURDAY.

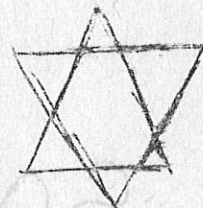
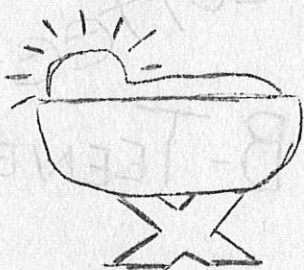
