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BOARD ACTIONS

- ▶ The Board conferred with legal counsel on legal and litigation issues and conducted several violation hearings and imposed fines.
- ▶ Discussion was held regarding status of completion of the Beach Bluff Park shower. Approval of a permit for completion is still pending, awaiting approval by the City.
- ▶ The Board made determinations on appeals from residents on Tree View Blockage (TVB) Committee decisions. An appeal from a homeowner in the Berkus Homes to reverse a decision of TVB requiring removal of palm trees was denied; an appeal from homeowners in the Garden Homes to reverse a decision of TVB to drastically trim or remove a Eucalyptus tree was approved.
- ▶ The Board accepted, with regret, the resignation of Darryl Drew as a member of the Architectural Control Committee.
- ▶ The board approved moving employee dental insurance coverage from Metlife to PacifiCare HMO at a substantial savings to the Association. The change also provides better dental coverage for the employees.
- ▶ Appointment of Norb Berberich as a member of the Finance Committee was confirmed by the Board of Directors.
- ▶ The Board discussed guidelines for reserving the Beach Bluff Park

FROM THE HELM

The proposed assessment for the Renovation of the Community Center sparked a lot of interest with 741 ballots received. A majority of the votes cast were not in favor of the proposed assessment. It was encouraging to have so many homeowners take an interest and cast their vote. Many residents volunteered their time to explain the options and the proposed renovations to the community. While they are too many to mention individually, I wish to acknowledge the tireless efforts of past Chairperson Roy Dohner, current Co-chairpersons Jerry Pearl and Jack Christensen, the *ad-hoc* committee and advisors at large. They spent many hours over the past 18 months on this process.

The NSCA budget is over \$2.3 million dollars. It takes much hard work, dedication and a good deal of expertise to efficiently and effectively administer community operations. Many community members have volunteered to assume these responsibilities. However, opportunities continue to open for new volunteers to make a contribution.

for private party use. Further discussion will follow at the October 6 meeting.

▶ The board agreed that results of the Special Assessment ballot for renovation of the Community Center would be immediately posted on the sign board outside of the MPR and on the Niguel Shores website and mailed to all members via first-class mail.

▶ A request for reimbursement of towing costs by a resident was denied.

▶ The Board awarded the Annual Slope Survey contract to Converse Consultants. West Coast Paving was awarded a contract to resolve a water intrusion/drainage problem on Ionian Bay.

▶ The Board approved postponing the scheduled replacement of two additional street entrances in the Garden Homes in order to develop new specifications due to sub-surface water problems encountered during replacement of the entrances at Coral Bay and Tasman Bay.

Open Garage Doors – Niguel Shores *CC&R's*, Article IX, Section 6, General Restrictions states, “..... When garages are not in use, garage doors shall be closed.”

Trash Containers – Niguel Shores *Rules and Regulations*, Rule 9204 states, “Trash containers shall not be placed out earlier than the evening before nor left out longer than the evening of the scheduled pick-up.”

The *CC&R's* and *Rules and Regulations* have been established for the benefit of all members and residents within the Association to assist in preserving values in the community and promoting harmony among neighbors. Please help maintain the standards and harmony of the community by complying with all of the rules.

Twice each month this committee meets to review submittals by owners who wish to improve their property. The committee is guided in all its actions by the *Rules and Regulations* approved by the Niguel Shores Community Association. Each property owner has been provided with a current copy of those *R&Rs*.

The Niguel Shores office staff can provide submittal forms, guidelines, and check lists that must be used to process each application. Homeowners are required to use these forms and the Committee is required to process each one carefully, responsibly, and reasonably. Please read the rules, including *Rule 3181* that allows the Association to charge a fee for those projects done without a permit, including those submitted "After the Fact."

The office staff will provide the proper forms, explain the rules, and expedite work. The committee is required to act on each request, on NSCA's behalf. The committee works diligently to decide each action according to the *Rules and Regulations* and to be fair to everyone in the community to the best of its ability.

CHILI COOKOFF

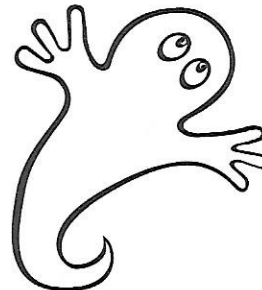

Question: Why is the Ports o' Call gate broken so often? One answer came to me the other day when a Niguel Shores resident (two cars in front of me) allowed a non-resident pick-up truck to follow them through the gate. The bar crashed down on the bed of his truck, but he didn't care - he only wanted to get through before the teeth came up. There is such a simple remedy to this problem. If you are going through any bar code gate and notice someone right on your tail, STOP just after your back tires have crossed the tooth guard and wait until the bar drops. The pole will not hit your car but will allow the teeth to come up and you can be on your way. The large metal gate will not close on you. If the car behind tries to come in, his tires will be punctured. By zooming through the gate, you may be aiding an unauthorized entry. Be responsible and do your part.

Question: There is a camera at these gates, why haven't we been catching and prosecuting those who are entering illegally and breaking our gates?

Let me take this opportunity to deconstruct the construction on Coral Bay. Last weekend the residents of Coral Bay were notified of driveway work on our street. After much discussion none of the residents of Coral Bay understood what type of work was going to be performed. It was not until work was begun that it meant the entrance to Coral Bay would be closed. The notice also made clear the work was going to be completed on August 19. As this letter is written we are into day seven of the work. It appears it will not be completed for another week. Each day on Atlantic Avenue will be affected. This lack of foresight demands certain questions be answered. How would fire and police access the street in emergencies? Will residents be compensated for gardening and housecleaning professionals who cannot access their clients? What are residents to do about trash? These are just some of the questions which residents of Atlantic Drive and Coral Bay deserve answers to before any more construction work is done.

Disabled residents were also not considered. There are some residents who need medical devices to sustain their lives. Are they supposed to live as shut-ins, not being able to freely move about? What would happen if a medical supply company could not deliver needed equipment or services?

This is one resident's view.

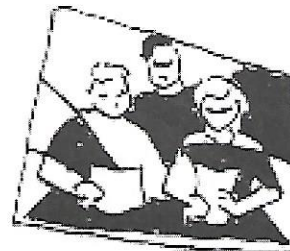

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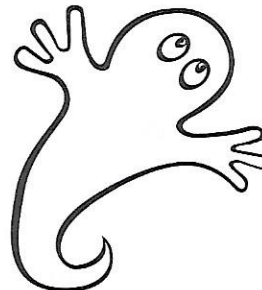
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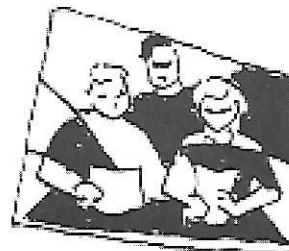
