

# COMMITTEE REPORTS

## ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

The Architectural Committee (AC) is required under both the recorded CC&Rs and the Bylaws and is charged with the responsibility of reviewing and approving or disapproving all applications for exterior modifications to a lot. Like all committees, the AC is comprised of owner volunteers. The Association would like to extend its gratitude to **Jeannie Sticher, John Yocca, Mike Stively, Trisha Pearson, John Chis, and Barbara Speare** for their time and service on the AC in 2022.

The Committee meets twice a month, on the first and third Mondays. As of the first meeting in November, the AC approved 216 architectural applications this year: 158 applications for replacement of an existing item, 29 applications for improvements (major hardscape and landscape projects), 16 change order applications for adjustments to an approved modification, and 13 remodels.

In addition, 2 applications were closed as incomplete while 10 applications were disapproved for conflict with the existing rules.

The community has been quite busy with construction in 2022 but all these improvements lead to retaining property values and keeping Niguel Shores beautiful.

## LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

### What We Do—

The Landscape Committee works toward a coordinated, consistent, and colorful community landscape. The committee advises on replacement of problem or high maintenance plant material with shrubs, trees,

and flowers that are non-invasive, that do not unreasonably impede views, and that minimize maintenance costs.

The committee also observes the performance of the landscape contractor and participates in the development of other contracted work. Committee members investigate homeowner requests, complaints and suggestions, and report their findings and recommendations to the whole committee at a meeting once a month.

## RECREATION AMENITIES COMMITTEE

As 2022 comes to an end, we are reminded of the accomplishments this past year. The Recreation Amenities Enhancement Project was a vision in 2019. Today, the enhancements are actually happening!

A special thank you to the project team for working diligently. The committee, along with the NSCA Board, are committed to completing the project in 2023. They continue to work on design reviews, and contract budgeting and scheduling.

In November, RRM was selected as the engineering contractor for this project. Over the next four months, engineering design drawings will be produced to obtain the necessary city permits and construction bids. Their subcontractor, KDM, started surveying the area in November using a drone for the topographic survey. The drones generate high-resolution and detailed 3D models, accurate to 2-3 cm horizontally and 5-6 cm vertically.





## Wellness . . . Purpose

Tiny birds flitted amongst the hanging feeders of black sunflower seeds and the bare branches of late fall and early winter. Clouds filled the sky above the hundred-year-old farmhouse where we were staying. Nature's palette was frosty gray with falling snow that November morning in northeastern Missouri, but you'd never know it by the number of winged visitors just outside the kitchen windows. To and fro, from tree to feeder, they glided despite the cold and the shifting wind. They had a single purpose in their lives at that moment, and it was to eat! To fill themselves with the energy they needed to live, fulfilling their role in the greater scheme of nature, and, I might add, also providing us with their visual and auditory beauty. The sense of calm I derived, simply watching those birds land on a tree or feeder, was a gift. You could say that might have been their purpose at that moment—to give joy in some way, in addition to seeking sustenance.

My husband and I were in Missouri, in an emotion-filled environment, for a relative's passing. We were reconnecting with family that we rarely had a chance to see, sharing stories that brought chuckles and tears. A loved one had moved on, leaving us thinking about this very short life of ours and what our purpose is intended to be as we travel through it. We may not even realize that this inner search for purpose is going on, due to the busyness of our modern, technologically-driven lives. But it





# MARKET UPDATE



## PRICE REDUCTIONS

Carefully pricing a home allows sellers to walk away with the most money possible and achieve success quickly.



## LOWEST LEVEL SINCE JUNE

The active listing inventory in the past couple of weeks decreased by 96 homes, down 3%, and now sits at 3,581 homes. In Oct., there were 35% fewer homes that came on the market compared to the 3-year average prior to COVID.



## DEMAND CONTINUES FALL

Demand, the number of pending sales over the prior month, decreased by 68 pending sales in the past two weeks, down 5%, and now totals 1,202, its lowest reading since April 2020.



## CLOSED SALES DOWN 38% Y-O-Y

There were 1,726 closed residential resales in October, 38% less than October 2021's 2,778 closed sales. October marked an 14% decrease compared to September 2022. The sales to list price ratio was 98.7% for all of O.C.
