#### 2023 Budget

By now you have all received a copy of your 2023 Budget with the increase to the assessments from \$915 to \$1,050 per quarter. As mentioned in the cover letter, this is due in part to the increase to many operating expenses as well as inflation. Another area the Board and Finance Committee

considered was the increase that needed to take place in the funding of reserves. The Reserve Analyst prepared the 2023 Reserve Study which showed Niguel Shores at 72.9% funded and dropping over the upcoming years. The Board wanted to keep these reserves moving upward (or not dropping as drastically) and therefore decided to increase the amount to be funded in the reserves for 2023.

A brief history on increases with this Association: Niguel Shores assessments in 2012 were \$830. There was not another increase for seven years until 2019 and the assessments went up to \$890. Then in 2020 the assessments were increased to the \$915 amount. The assessments have remained at \$915 for three years even though many expenses increased over these past three years. In order to remain within a safe amount for reserves, the Board voted for the increased assessment this year.

Both the Finance Committee and the Board will continue to monitor the budgets, funding of reserves, increase to many operating expenses and inflation as we move through 2023 and prepare for future funding and assessments if needed.

#### **Christmas Tree Disposal**

CR&R will pick up your Christmas tree on your regular scheduled day for trash service at no charge. The tree must be free of all ornaments, lights, not attached to a stand, not flocked and not placed in a bag. The tree cannot exceed 6 feet. If it does exceed this height, cut off the top and throw that in the green trash. If you have any additional questions, you may contact CR&R at (877) 728-0446.

#### ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

**Story Poles** 

As the name implies, story poles are used during certain construction projects to give a visualization—or tell the "story"—of a proposed structure by illustrating its outline.



A structural addition requires the use of story poles prior to any construction so that surrounding homeowners can be made aware of the project and any visual impact it may have. Major remodels require the mockup to be certified by a licensed surveyor or civil engineer.

The Architectural Committee mails notices to directly adjacent properties when story poles are put in place to allow input from surrounding residents. However, the slopes and contours of our community make it impossible to identify every view corridor that might be affected.

If you see a mockup that you feel may impact your view, please contact the Niguel Shores Office regardless of whether you received a written notice. Questions or responses should always be directed to the Architectural Committee—not the homeowner with the mockup in place. Karen Decker is the Architectural Manager overseeing this process. 

#### PAGE TURNERS

The new year finds all three Page Turners groups returning to our regular reading schedule, and this month's book is Rain of Gold by Victor Villasenor. While looking into some reviews of this book in preparation of writing this article, I found that there was/is some confusion on the part of the reviewers as to whether the book

is fiction or nonfiction—the book is nonfiction. See the following reviews:

"Rain of Gold is a true-life saga of love, family and destiny that pulses with bold vitality, sweeping from the war-ravaged Mexican mountains of Pancho Villa's revolution to the days of Prohibition in California." (Arte Publico Press, publisher)

The book tells the saga of the author's family, their immigration to California and their lives there.



"A sort of Hispanic Roots, the book focuses on three generations as they struggle with poverty and prejudice, love and life. When Villasenor was first contracted to write Rain of Gold, it was to be a 'major' work of fiction. As he began interviewing his relatives for background material, however, he realized that there was a much more important story to tell: the nonfiction account of his family's history. Unable to convince his publisher to

go along with his new plans, Villasenor gave back his \$75,000 advance, took a \$1,500 advance from a lesserknown house, and set about writing 'a history of a people—a tribal heritage, if you will—of my Indian-European culture as handed down to me ..." (Kirkus Review)

"Though marred at times by sentimentality and clichés, [the book] is a gripping, inspirational epic full of wild adventure, bootlegging, young love, miracles, tragedies, murder and triumph over cultural barriers." (Publishers Weekly)







# MARKET UPDATE





#### NOT THE GREAT RECESSION

With a very limited inventory of available homes coupled with over a decade of tight lending standards, housing values will not nosedive like they did during the Great Recession.



#### SUPPLY DECREASE CONTINUES

The active listing inventory in the past couple of weeks decreased by 104 homes, down 3%, and now sits at 3,182 homes, its lowest level since the start of June. In Nov., there were 32% fewer homes that came on the market compared to the 3-year average prior to COVID.



#### DEMAND STILL FALLING

Demand, the number of pending sales over the prior month, plunged by 79 pending sales in the past two weeks, down 7%, and now totals 1,133, its lowest level since April 2020.



#### CLOSED SALES DOWN 44% Y-O-Y

There were 1,427 closed residential resales in November, 44% less than November 2021's 2,570 closed sales. November marked an 17% decrease compared to October 2022. The sales to list price ratio was 97.5% for all of O.C.
